Derby City Council are considering making a Designated Public Places Order in respect of the following streets and land in the Castleward area of Derby City Centre:

A copy of the plan showing the areas it is proposed to designate as public places under the Order can be inspected at the main reception desk at the Council House from 8.30am to 5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

The effect of the Order will be that a police officer will have the power to require a person in the designated place not to drink alcohol where the officer believes that person is, has or intends to do so. The officer can also require the person to surrender any alcohol, including alcohol in sealed containers. Failure to comply with the officer's request without a reasonable excuse will be an arrestable offence.

Bass's Recreation Ground (Grid reference 435908 – 336133) would be excluded from the Order at times when alcohol is being sold or supplied and within 30 minutes thereafter.
