

Commercial Waste

Purpose

- 1.1 Scrutiny have asked for a report on the disposal of trade waste from Derby City Council (DCC) operated sites like Derby Arena
- 1.2 A decision was made at cabinet to delegate the collection and disposal of our commercial waste to Nottingham City Council (NCC). Since April 2018 NCC have been responsible for the collection and disposal of DCC's trade waste

Supporting information

- 4.1 Derby City Council (DCC) currently pays NCC to collect and dispose of our trade waste as part of the delegation, this service is provided to all of our sites. NCC currently collects all of our residual and recycling waste.
- 4.2 In April 2018 when the service transferred to NCC it was agreed that a figure of £330k would be paid annually for DCC's trade waste, this included approx. £162k for schools. During the first year of operation it was deemed that this figure was set to high and was reduced to £167k. This included approx. £77k for schools. Following further rationalisation, obtaining up-to-date information from sites and some schools transferring to academies the forecasted cost to DCC is £155k which includes approx. £50k for schools for 2019/20.

Looking at the figures above it is clear that the Council and School colleagues have seen a reduction in the amount we spend on trade waste over the last 2 years.
