Progress To Date

17 Public Protection Officers (PPOs) recruited and trained to act as visible guardians across our City.

Devolved ward funding has been established and is being used to deliver key local priorities.

A City Centre Safer and Cleaner Plan is being developed to shape and co-ordinate activity across key public spaces.

A New 'Citywide Problem Solving Model' is being developed to prevent and tackle crime, antisocial behaviour and environmental crime.

Opportunities

Our increased, visible, uniformed presence will help in the; prevention, investigation and detection of crime, anti-social behaviour and environmental crime – improving quality of life.

Our new problem solving model will focus and align our departmental resources on our riskiest people, places, and premises across Derby.

Through continued partnership working we will look to establish a new 'City Centre Community Safety Hub' with Derbyshire Police and the University of Derby.

We will be looking to co-locate services in our neighbourhoods also.

Recruitment of a City Centre Manager will provide us with more capacity to shape and coordinate activities in our key city centre locations to address street scene issues.







Moving Forward

PPOs to be present in each ward to target priority anti-social behaviour and environmental crime issues identified by Neighbourhood Boards and residents.

Fully establish the new 'problem solving model' across our department to further configure our resources and focus on priority people, places and premises.

Continue to strengthen our relationships with key local partners to deliver more effective and resilient local public services that focus on shared challenges.
