# Application for a Provisional Statement at: St James' Yard, St James' Street, Derby DE1 1RN

### SUMMARY

- 1.1 An application for a Provisional Statement at: St James's Yard, St James' Street, Derby DE1 1RN has been received by Derby City Council's Licensing Team.
- 1.2 The sale by retail of alcohol; the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to A member of the club; the provision of regulated entertainment; and the provision of late night refreshment must be licensed under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.3 Application for a Provisional Statement is a mechanism whereby a person who would in the future be applying for a Premises Licence can obtain a Provisional Statement which indicates the prospects of success when there is an application for a Premises Licence is made.
- 1.4 The issuing of a Provisional Statement does not automatic convert to a Premises Licence and an application for a Premises Licence will need to be submitted, however the ability to make representations is restricted.
- 1.5 Officers have delegated powers to deal with applications for Provisional Statements where there are no Relevant Representations received; however this is not the case with this application and hence attendance at committee today.
- 1.6 The General Licensing Sub Committee must:
  - Determine whether, on the basis of those representations and the Provisional Statement application, it would consider it appropriate to take any steps under section 18 (3)(b) if, on the works being satisfactorily completed, it had to decide whether to grant a Premises Licence in the form described in the Provisional Statement application

and

- Issue a statement which gives details of:
- The determination

and

The authority's reason for its decision as to the steps (if any) that would be appropriate to take under section 18 (3)(b).

### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

4.1 An application for a Provisional Statement was received by Derby City Council's Licensing Team from Clowes Developments (UK) Ltd, Brailsford Hall, Hall Lane, Brailsford, Derbyshire DE6 3BU on 9 April 2018.

A copy is attached at Appendix 1.

4.2 The Licensing Team has received two Relevant Representations, from Responsible Authorities: Derbyshire Constabulary and Derby City Council's Licensing Authority. There is one representation supporting the application. The Environmental Protection and Trading Standards Teams have agreed conditions with the applicant.

These are all attached at Appendix 2.

## 4.4 The licensable activities applied for are:

- \* the supply of by retail of alcohol (off/on the premises)
- Regulated Entertainment; a performance of live music (indoors) and any playing of recorded music (indoors).
- The provision of late night refreshment.

### 4.5 The days and times of the licensable activities applied for are:

10.00hrs to 00.00hrs Sunday – Thursday & 10.00hrs – 01.00hrs Friday & Saturday for all activities with the exception of Late Night Refreshment which is 11.00hrs to 00:00hrs Sunday – Thursday & 10.00hrs – 01.00hrs Friday & Saturday.

Non-standard times: For all licensable activities applied for:

New Year's Eve - From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

## 4.6 The days and times the premises are open to the public are:

09:00hrs to 00:30hrs Sunday - Thursday & 09.00hrs - 01.30hrs Friday & Saturday.

### Non-standard times:

New Year's Eve - From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

### 4.7 The Proposed Premises Licence Holder is:

Clowes Developments (UK) Ltd

- 4.8 The Proposed Designated Premises Supervisor is: Unnamed
- 4.9 A location plan of the premises is attached at **Appendix 3**.
- 4.10 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:
  - · the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - public safety;
  - the prevention of public nuisance;
  - the protection of children from harm.
- 4.11 In making its decision, the Committee is also obliged to have regard to national Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Licensing Policy.
- 4.12 The Council recognises the importance of securing proper integration with and attaching relevant conditions that reflect local strategies.
- 4.13 The Council has a duty to act in a manner which is compatible with the Human Rights Act 1998.
- 4.14 A Licence is regarded as property for the purposes of the Human Rights Act 1998. Article 1 of the First Protocol states that:

"Every natural or legal person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions. No one shall be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and subject to the conditions provided for by law and by the general principles of international law.

The preceding provisions shall not, however, in any way impair the right of a State to enforce such laws as it deems necessary to control the use of property in accordance with the general interest or to secure the payment of taxes or other contributions or penalties."

- 4.15 The Committee must also take into account the effect on local residents. Article 8 states:
  - Everyone has the right to respect for his private and family life, his home and his correspondence.
  - There shall be no interference by a public authority with the exercise of this right except such as is in accordance with the law and is necessary in a democratic society in the interests of national security, public safety or the economic wellbeing of the country, for the prevention of disorder or crime, for the protection of health or morals, or for the protection of the rights and freedoms of others.

### 4.16 Three stage test to be applied:

- Is the interference in accordance with the law?
- Is the interference necessary in a democratic society in pursuit of one of the legitimate aims set out above?


Is the decision proportionate ie. Striking a fair balance between the demands of the general interests of the community and the requirement to protect the individual's fundamental rights?

The works have started and are provisionally scheduled to complete this summer. The restoration and refurbishment of the former stables building for the St James Hotel will provide approximately 1250 m2 floor space. This includes frontage properties to 2-4 The Strand and 8 The Strand. All works being carried out are in conjunction with Derby City Council and relate to buildings that are either listed or within a conservation area.

We enclose a layout plan for the site which shows the work being done and about to be done at the premises as part of the application.

Please give particulars of the premises to which the application relates (please read guidance note 1)
Clowes Developments (UK) Limited has owned these buildings for in excess of 20 years. The buildings have never been accessible to the public and therefore the restoration will provide access to historic buildings that have never been seen. The restoration is sympathetic to the previous use of the building with a modern twist that includes glazing roofs to connect buildings. A Provisional Statement will give the confidence to occupiers to pursue their interest. Previous similar schemes undertaken by Clowes Developments (UK) Limited within the city centre include, Revolucion de Cuba and the Cosy Club. Both properties continue to be owned by Clowes Developments (UK) Limited and both have been restored to a very high standard providing a unique bar/entertainment/eating venue within a historic setting. The same is anticipated within St James Yard.

## a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c,d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

[The information provided in this box is solely for information only and not intended to be converted into conditions on the Provisional Statement]

The applicant is fully aware of the cumulative impact policy zone which is in place in the city centre and this has been taken into consideration along with promoting the four licensing objectives in preparing this application. The proposed conditions contained in the operating schedule are both extensive and enforceable and go beyond those required by law or regulation and have specifically been proposed to address the cumulative impact policy and to uphold the licensing objectives.

The proposed condition to have 70% of the existing floor space of the premises to be allocated for the use of customers eating at the premises, along with the other proposed conditions, demonstrates the measures put in place in order to control the operation of the premises and to prevent adding to the existing cumulative impact. Furthermore, with this condition proposed it shows that any potential operator could not initially once the application is granted turn the premises into a solely vertical drinking establishment.

Considering the above, we believe that the granting of the application would not have an adverse impact on the licensing objectives and we believe that the measures proposed will ensure the premises promote the licensing objectives, and that these measures are adequate and further conditions are not required.

### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- From 22:00 hours on Friday and Saturday a minimum of 1 SIA licensed door supervisor shall be on duty at the premises and shall remain on duty until close. At all other times the need for door supervisors will be assessed by way of a risk assessment carried out by the Designated Premises Supervisor and cognisance will be taken of any Police advice.
- 2. All door supervisors engaged outside the entrance/exit of the premises will wear high visibility clothing at all times
- 3. A register of those Door Supervisors employed and on duty at the premise shall be maintained and shall include;
  - a. The number of Door Supervisors on duty
  - b. The identity and badge number of each Door Supervisor on duty
  - c. The time each Door Supervisor books on and off duty
  - d. A signature of each Door Supervisor on duty
- 4. An incident log shall kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Police, which will record the following:
  - a) All crimes reported to the venue
  - b) All ejections of patrons
  - c) Any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
  - d) Any incidents of disorder
  - e) All seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - f) Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
  - g) Any refusal of sale of alcohol
  - h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- The Door Supervisors register shall be kept on the premises for a period of not less than 12
  months and shall be produced upon request of a Police Officer or other authorised person
- 6. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be made available for inspection at the premises by the Police at all times whilst the premises are open
- 7. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.

- Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised council officer through the entire 31 day period.
- 8. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 9. The DPS or nominated representative shall be an active member of the local Pub Watch Scheme where such a scheme exists

#### c) Public safety

- 10. The premises licence holder shall ensure that an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials is available on the premises and at least one suitably trained first aider shall be on duty when the public are present.
- 11. A minimum of 70% of the existing floor space of the premises shall be allocated for the use of customers eating at the premises.

### d) The prevention of public nuisance

- 12. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly.
- 13. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance
- 14. Open containers of alcohol shall not be removed from the premises, save for consumption in any delineated external area as shown on the plan attached
- 15. Empty glasses shall be regularly collected and any spillage dealt with as soon as practicable
- 16. No speakers for amplification of music shall be placed on the outside of the premises, or on the outside of the building forming part of the premises
- 17. Doors and windows at the premises are to remain closed after 23:00 save for access and egress.
- 18. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 07.00 hours on the following day
- 19. A Dispersal and Smoking Policy will be implemented and adhered to.
- 20. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises

### e) The protection of children from harm

- 21. A challenge 21 or similar Proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram
- 22. Full training shall be provided to all staff on commencement of employment relating to all age-restricted products sold and any system or procedures they are expected to follow in the course of dealing with these goods. Refresher training shall be provided at regular intervals at least every 6 months. All records detailing the training provided must be written and kept on the premises for a minimum of 12 months and for production upon request of a Police Officer or other authorised person
- 23. Clear, prominent and unobstructed signage informing customers of the proof of age scheme in operation, along with the age restrictions on products shall be displayed at all entry points to the premises.
- 24. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be made available for inspection at the premises by the Police at all times whilst the premises are open. This should be retained on the premises for a minimum of 12 months.



The Police are aware that these premises are currently undergoing extensive reconstruction work and a buyer or tenant is yet to be found.

The Licensing Authority will be aware that the application sets out a request for the licensable activities of the provision of regulated entertainment, the provision of late night refreshment and the supply of alcohol. The hours that the premises are open to the public are requested as Monday to Sunday 09:00 am - 01:30 am.

The regulated entertainment requested within the application is as follows:

Live Music: Sunday

Sunday - Thursday 10:00 - 00:00

Friday - Saturday 10:00 - 01:00

Recorded Music:

Sunday - Thursday 10:00 - 00:00

Friday - Saturday 10:00 - 01:00

The Late night refreshment requested within the application is as follows;

Sunday - Thursday 23:00 - 00:00

Friday - Saturday 23:00 - 01:00

The supply of alcohol requested within the application is as follows:

Sunday - Thursday 10:00 - 00:00

Friday - Saturday 10:00 - 01:00

And the hours open to the public requested within the application is as follows;

Sunday - Thursday 09:00 - 00:30

Friday - Saturday 09:00 - 01:30

The Police have examined the proposed operating schedule included in the application and have contrasted the requested licensable activities and proposed hours with the steps to be taken at Section "M" of the schedule.

The Licensing Authority will be aware that in October 2011, and after representations from the Derbyshire Constabulary on 3rd November 2010, a Special Policy of Cumulative Impact (also known as a Cumulative Impact Zone) was adopted. This policy was reviewed by the Licensing Authority in December 2015 with further evidence being submitted by the police to support its continued necessity.

The Cumulative Impact Policy is included in the current Statement of Licensing Policy which is given a footing in statute at Section 5 of The Licensing Act 2003. The Special Policy is contained within Appendix 3 of the Statement of Licensing Policy produced by Derby City Council.

The representation from the Derbyshire Constabulary that gave rise to the adoption of such a policy included concerns and evidence relating to a high level of recorded incidents and crimes occurring in the area of the city inside the 'inner ring road' and particularly between the hours of midnight and 04:00. This problem is particularly exacerbated on Fridays and Saturdays.

The statement of Licensing Policy states at paragraph 6.8 "A special policy would not prevent the Council considering future applications as each application is considered on its own merits. However, where a special policy has been agreed, applications for a licence will normally be refused where relevant representations have been made. The applicant will need to demonstrate how the premises would not add to the cumulative impact on the area concerned."

Having regard to the Special Policy, the four licensing objectives (but particularly the prevention of crime and disorder), it is the opinion of the Chief Officer of Police that this application does not sufficiently demonstrate that the premises, if it were to benefit from a premises licence, would not add to the existing and cumulative impact. Although, the Special Policy is mentioned in the application it is not specific when demonstrating how the venue will not add to the cumulative impact already experienced within the City.

The applicant at this time has shown a lack of understanding of the Night Time Economy specific to Derby City Centre, they have requested hours that have a high probability of causing an adverse impact at a very busy time, at an intersection which is a renowned "hot spot" for alcohol related crime and disorder. The applicant has falled at this time to provide sufficient additional steps to ensure that no further cumulative impact is likely to occur. I would argue that the conditions offered have not been "specifically" proposed to address the cumulative impact policy, as stated within the application. The steps proposed in the application although extensive, very rarely extend further than those expected from any competent operator for a venue of this size and type in a City Centre location, they do not provide the Police with any additional confidence that proper regard has been taken of the four licensing objectives and basis upon which the Special Policy was adopted.

The applicant has previously submitted a Premises Licence application for these premises which was described in the application as "A public house in Derby City Centre". The application that was submitted in February of this year was subject to an objection by the police and the Licensing Authority after due consideration it was subsequently withdrawn by the applicant.

The plan attached to the application has been varied in an effort to be a little more transparent. Although there is a kitchen and seating area allocated, I would suggest that the areas indicated as "Bars" give concern that "vertical" drinking is intended to play a large part of this venues operation. Indeed the police have concerns that within this provisional statement the applicant makes comment "that any operator could not *initially* once the application is granted turn the premises into a solely vertical drinking establishment". This comment in its self would suggest that once granted the intention of any operator may be to apply for a variation to convert the premises into a vertical drinking establishment and this initial application may be a way to circumvent the existing "Cumulative Impact Policy"?

It has been confirmed by the applicant that this premises licence application is to cover one single unit, this seems to conflict with the planning application where it is suggested that two units are proposed. One of which is for A3 use - "Restaurants and cafes" and the other for A4 use - "Drinking establishments". Again this throws further doubt as to what the intended use of the building is for?

The Chief Officer of Police is aware of the case of Brewdog Bars Limited v Leeds City Council, Leeds Magistrates' Court, 6th September 2012, where an appeal against the decision of a Licensing Authority to refuse an application in an area of Cumulative Impact was heard. The applicant, Brewdog Bars Limited, persuaded District Judge Anderson to overturn the decision and the District Judge reliterated that the effect of such a policy was not to "bring down the iron curtain" on allowing a new premises licence to be granted. The Police are aware that this decision is persuasive and not binding.

it is the position of the Chief Officer of Police that there is no "Iron curtain" approach in the City of Derby. Each application will be and is assessed on its own merits and against the perceived impact on the four licensing objectives. Those premises that propose to operate in such a way so as to actively demonstrate a commitment to promoting the ilcensing objectives will be supported where the operation of the premises, including the proposed activities carried on, the proposed operating hours, and the target clientele, are such that it cannot be considered that an impact on those objectives could reasonably be observed.

This premise is situated on The Strand, with the main entrance on the junction of St James Street; the area is saturated with other late night time venues, clubs, pubs, restaurants and take-a ways that already attract an unacceptable amount of disorder issues. It is the opinion of the Chief Officer of Police that if granted at this location, open until the times applied for, would cause an additional burden on the emergency services and other agencies working in and around the City Centre. Additional drunken people will leave the proposed venue at 01:30 and possibly congregate at this very busy junction, this would contribute to what already has become a flash point for crime and disorder in the area.

The evidence submitted to the Licensing Authority by the Derbyshire Constabulary for the current Licensing Policy regarding the "CIZ" remains valid. The concerns of the Police in relation to new premises and variations to premises licences also remain valid. It is the opinion of the Chief of Police that this application should not be granted in light of the above information, the perceived impact on the four licensing objectives and when having additional regard to the effect of the Special Policy of Cumulative Impact.

A further bundle containing representations will be submitted, if required, in due course. However, please take this as formal notification of a representation under Section 18(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.



In addition to what we have already proposed in the operating schedule of our attached Provisional Statement application, please find below our comments to your proposals:-

1. All external doors and windows must be kept closed, other than for access and egress, when activities involving live music or amplified music/speech are taking place.

We would agree to the following wording "All external doors and windows must be kept closed when regulated entertainment in the form of live or recorded music are taking place and in any event after 23:00 hours save for access and egress and in the case of an emergency"

This would replace proposed condition 17

2. No amplified music or speech shall be relayed externally via loudspeakers.

This has already been proposed at condition 16

3. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises, requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

This is a duplication of proposed condition 12

4. Refuse, such as bottles, shall not be placed into receptacles outside the premises between 11pm and 8am, in order to minimise the disturbance to nearby properties.

We would agree to the following wording "No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day."

This would replace proposed condition 18

5. The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events. A record of all complaints and of any action taken as a result, shall be maintained in a 'complaints logbook' kept specifically for that purpose. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police Constable, or any other authorised person (as detailed within Section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003), upon their request.

Agree

6. Noise shall be inaudible outside noise sensitive premises after 11:00pm. A record of these checks and of any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a logbook kept specifically for that purpose. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police Constable, or any other authorised person (as detailed within Section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003), upon their request.

We do not agree to this inaudibility condition as it is not proportionate and can create too much of an issue for licensed premises. We have proposed condition 13 which states "No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance" and we consider this to be both effective and proportionate

7. The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall monitor the effect of patrons leaving the premises from time to time and at least once a week. A record of the monitoring and of any matters giving rise to concern shall be maintained in a logbook. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police Constable, or any other authorised person (as detailed within Section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003), upon their request.

We do not agree to this condition as we are already proposing to have door staff in place during key times when the premises are open and an incident log shall be kept at the premises which will record all ejections of patrons and any incidents of disorder. With these measures in place we submit that the premises will be able to monitor customers without the need to add the further condition requested above. Furthermore, condition 7 in our application proposes that the premises will have CCTV in place which will cover all entry and exit points.

Once you have reviewed our proposals could you please confirm that you are happy with it all. I will then forward it to the Licensing Department for them to amend the application.
