SUSPENSION NOTICES

Since April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who have not paid their annual fees.

In quarter three, 50 suspension notices were issued during the period. The total outstanding was £8315. 37 paid realising £5855. Of the remaining 13, 2 licences were found to have lapsed, 4 have been surrendered, 6 suspensions remain in place, but are not currently trading. Enforcement action is being taken against the remaining 1 licence holder.

Since April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who have not paid their annual fees.

In quarter four, 49 suspension notices were issued during the period. The total outstanding was £8830. 41paid realising £7730. Of the remaining 8, 1 licence was found to have lapsed, 1 has been surrendered, 5 suspensions remain in place, but are not currently trading. The remaining licence holder is under investigation.
