The Derby Safer Communities Board Purpose and Functions:

- Act as the cities statutory Community Safety Executive
- To identify and agree the yearly strategic priorities for the city in relation to crime, disorder and community safety, based upon strategic risk and threats
- Produce a yearly plan outlining the priorities and key tactical approaches
- To review the strategic plan and ensure delivery
- Identify blockages or improvements to deliver the plan
- Ensure the strategic plan is delivered in partnership with key agencies and partners
- If necessary establish task and finish groups to problem solve and plan for specific issues or emerging risk and threats

The board meets quarterly chaired by the Chief Executive of Derby City Council as the lead authority and a funded priority area.
