Summary – The Local Plan Part 1, or Core Strategy, sets out the Council's town planning policies and allocates land for new development - especially land for housing. Work has progressed over the past few years with the nature of the plan changing over time as national requirements have changed. It has also been prepared in alignment with the plans of South Derbyshire and Amber Valley. Following a lengthy period of preparation and consultation, an Examination into the Submitted Plan was held in mid 2016.
