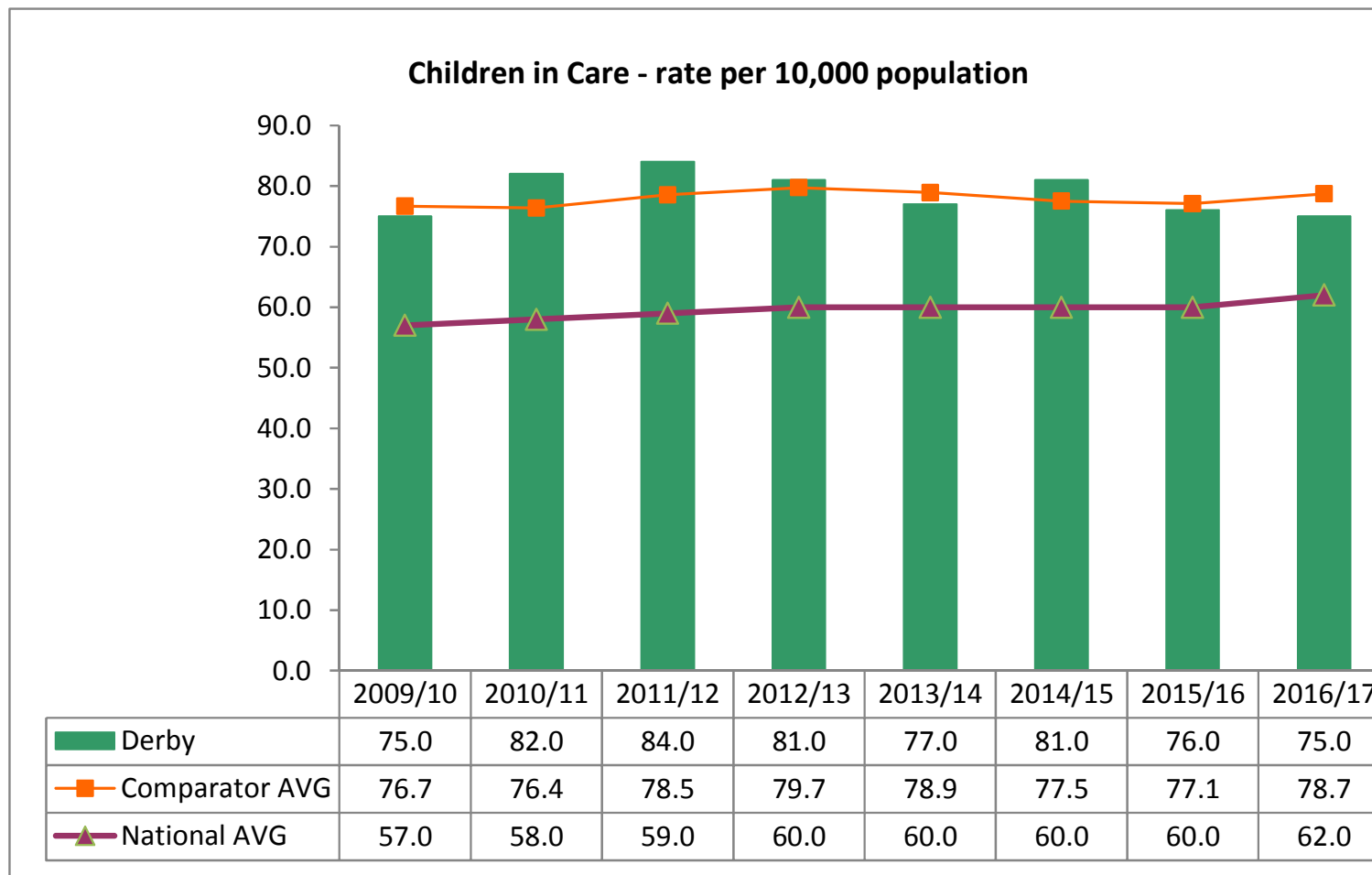

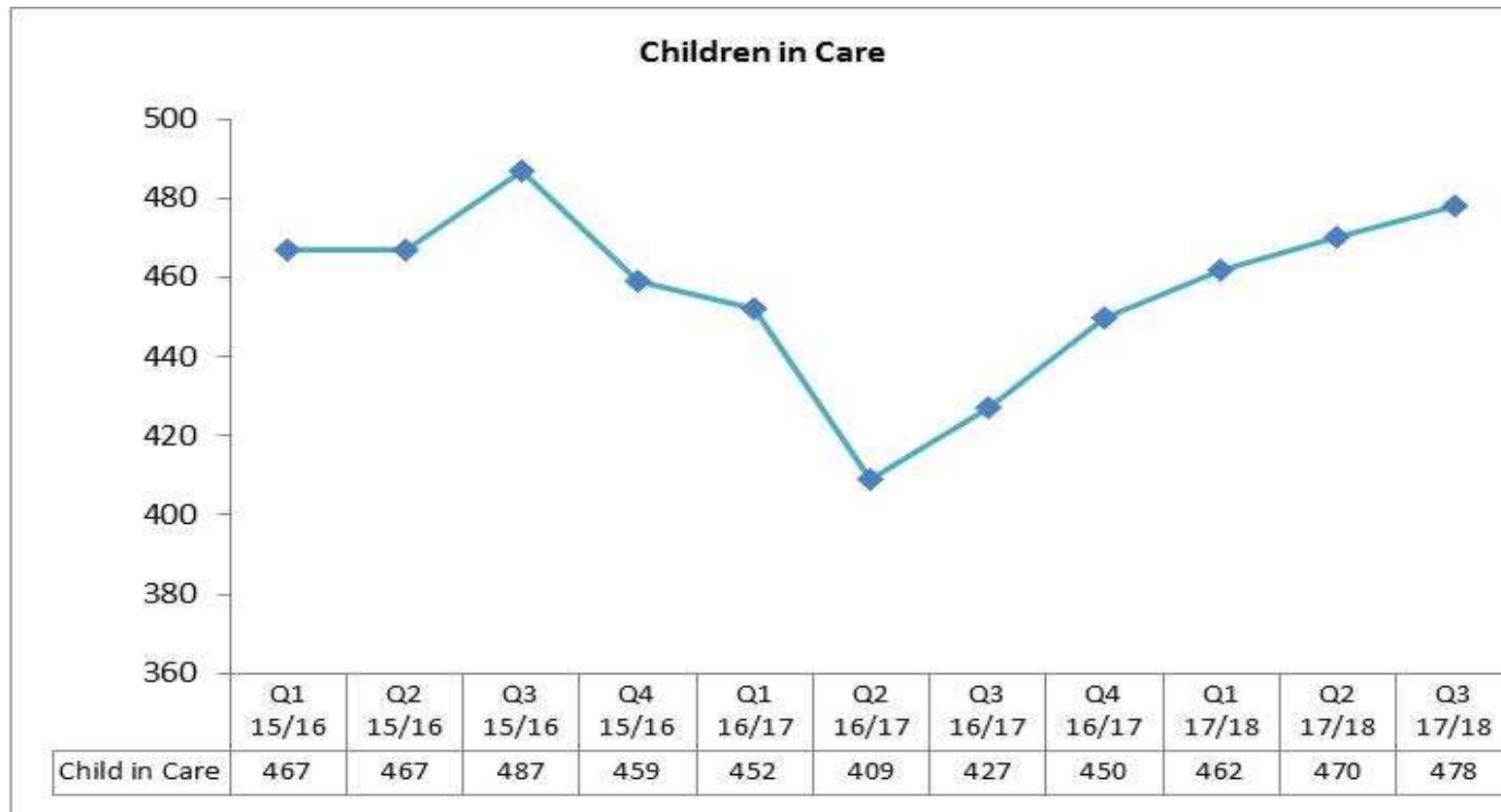


Historical trends



At the end of March 2017 Derby had 450 looked after children, **remaining below the comparator average for a second year running**, following a rise in 2015

Latest trends



Overall, the numbers of children entering care have however increased since April 2017, with an average of 67 per quarter (every three months) compared to an average of 53 per quarter in 2016/17



Derby's looked after children and young people

At the end of March 2017, the largest percentage of Derby's looked after children and young people were...

- male (57%)
- aged 10-15 years (38%)
- White British (77%)
- placed in a foster care (73%)

70% of Derby's CYP were placed less than 20 miles away, which is less than both the national and comparator averages

Additional local outcomes / measures

At the end of December 2017...

- Stability of placements
 - 70% of our young people looked after for a year or more have been in the same placement for more than 2 years (1% increase from March 2017)
 - 8.2% of our young people looked after for more than a year have moved three or more times in the last year (2% improvement from March 2017)
- 97% of young people have participated in their reviews (7% rise from March 2017) with 97% of reviews taking place within statutory timescales (6% improvement from March 2017)
- 94% of our children and young people had an up to date PEP (*measure is subject to seasonal variation*)
