I am applying for this review on behalf of the Licensing Authority as a Responsible Authority under s13 (4) of the Licensing Act (the Act).

On 3 May 2018 at Derby and Southern Derbyshire Magistrates Court the premises licence holder, HKB Enterprises Ltd (the Company) pleaded guilty to one offence under s 136 (1)(b) of the Act, that of knowingly allowing unauthorised licensable activities at the Hairy Dog, Becket Street, DE 1HT. On 6 October 2017 HKB Enterprises Ltd provided unlicensed wrestling entertainment on the Hairy Dog. The company was fined £3000 with £1478.59 costs.

On the same day at the Magistrates' Court the designated premises supervisor at the Hairy Dog, Mr Paul Keenan, pleaded guilty to three offences under s136 (1)(a) for carrying on unauthorised licensable activities. This relates to three wrestling events on 2 June 2017, 2 September 2017 and 6 October 2017. Mr Keenan was fined £6000 with £1478.59 costs.

The Licensing Authority has serious concerns with the Company's inability, or unwillingness to comply with the legislation. This apparent inaction undermines the licensing objectives.

The role of the designated premises supervisor, although is not strictly defined under the Act, the statutory guidance issued under s 182 of the Act suggests the designated premises supervisor is: 'one specified individual...that person will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the premises licence holder'

These responsibilities would include, operating the business within the confines of the existing authorisation (licence), adherence to the licence conditions, and promoting the four licensing objectives.

Despite being contacted many times by telephone, email and formal letter, HKB Enterprises Ltd and Mr Paul Keenan failed to obtain the correct authorisation for the wrestling events and showed complete disregard to the requirements of the legislation, and their duties under it.

This review is submitted based around the prevention of crime and disorder objective.

This request is for the revocation of the premises licence, as additional conditions or removal of the designated premises supervisor, will not give the Licensing Authority any confidence that the management will comply with the legislation, or promote the crime and disorder licensing objective in the future.

The Licensing Team became aware, via a telephone call, of a wrestling event due to take place at the Hairy Dog on 2 June 2017. The premises licence in place at the venue did not cover wrestling. Mr David Basford, Licensing Enforcement Officer contacted Mr Keenan. Mr Basford explained to Mr Keenan that wrestling was not included on the premises licence for the Hairy Dog. The legal position was also outlined in an email and sent to the email address provided by the premises licence holder, HKB Enterprises Ltd.

Later that evening on 2 June 2017, two officers from the Council's Food and Safety Team, Mrs Jenny Mugglestone and Miss Jane Gregson visited the Hairy Dog and witnessed the wrestling entertainment taking place. This was also backed up by a later visit from PC Mark Suiter from the Licensing Team of Derbyshire Constabulary. All three officers provided a written statement, and PC Suiter provided bodycam video footage.

On 1 September 2017, a telephone call was received saying there was another wrestling event due to take place that evening. Again, Mr Keenan was contacted by a member of the Licensing Team, and he said the entertainment was going ahead as planned, despite not having the correct authorisation on the premises licence.

Later that evening, PC Mark Dunn visited the premises and established the wrestling was taking place as planned. He provided a statement and bodycam video footage.

On 1 September 2017 Mr David Basford wrote a letter to the Company stipulating wrestling was covered by their current premises licence. Later on 14 September Mrs Sandra Mansell also wrote a warning letter to HKB Enterprises Ltd regarding the scheduled wrestling event planned for 6 October 2017, and informed them a prosecution file had been compiled and the file was currently with the Council's Legal Team.

I am the above named person and am employed within the Licensing Team at Derby City Council as an Enforcement Officer. Part of my normal duties includes the enforcement of legislation under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of licensed premises in Derby.

On Friday 2nd June 2017, I was on duty at the Licensing Office at the Council House, Derby. Sometime around 2.00pm my colleague, Julie Robinson, who is a Licensing Officer in the Licensing Team, told me that she had received an anonymous telephone call alleging that a form of wrestling entertainment was scheduled to take place at a premises in Derby city centre called The Hairy Dog.

Mrs Robinson showed me some advance publicity for the event, which she had displayed on her computer screen. It referred to a wrestling event, the promoter of which was a company called HOPE WRESTLING. The image on the screen was of several people in what I took to be wrestling kit and had a tag line of something to the effect of "It's gonna be havoc". It was scheduled to take place at The Hairy Dog, Becket Street, Derby, on Friday 2nd June 2017. Doors were scheduled to open at 07.30 pm, with the show starting at 08.00pm and was advertised as being for "over 18's" only. The admission fee was £10.00.

I was aware that the Hairy Dog is a licensed premises located at Becket Street in Derby city centre. Licensing records showed that a current premises Licence was in force in respect of the premises, licence number PL10551179.

I checked computerised records held by the Licensing Team to ascertain whether or not the Hairy Dog's Premises Licence authorised wrestling entertainment.

STATEMENT OF WITNESS

The provision of wrestling entertainment is a licensable activity under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003 and my check showed that the licence in respect of the Hairy Dog did not authorise such activity.

The licence in question showed the Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Hairy Dog to be PAUL KEENAN. I obtained a telephone number for Mr Keenan from Licensing records, that number being 07446 845555. Sometime between 2.00pm and 3.00pm on 2nd June, I called Mr Keenan and explained that it had been brought to my attention that wrestling entertainment was scheduled to take place at the Hairy Dog that night.

The person I spoke to confirmed that he was Paul Keenan. With regard to the particular event, Mr Keenan initially stated that it was not wrestling, it was a play. He advised me that it was considered to be a play because the action was choreographed and the result was pre-determined. Mr Keenan also said that he believed the licence did authorise wrestling in any case because it did authorise indoor sporting events.

I advised Mr Keenan that, although "indoor sporting events" were authorised by the licence, wrestling entertainment is a separate licensable activity, not covered by such authorisation. I also questioned his description that the entertainment was a play and pointed out that the promoter was called Hope Wrestling.

Mr Keenan then agreed the event was wrestling and that the event had been organised for around 6 months and 100 tickets had been sold. The last thing Mr Keenan said was that he would consult his solicitor and he would call me back. Mr Keenan did not call me back and has not made contact prior to the date of this statement.

At 3.28pm I sent an email to the email address Licensing has on file for the Hairy Dog: paulhairydogderby@gmail.com confirming the legal position and advising that it is an offence to carry out a licensable activity without having the necessary authorisation. That email has not been returned as undelivered.

A copy of that email is attached to this statement, marked DB1.

A print-out, taken off the website of Hope Wrestling, consisting of 2 pages, which references the show at the Hairy Dog on 2 June 2017, is attached to this statement marked DB2.

A copy of the Premises Licence in respect of the Hairy Dog is attached to this statement, marked DB3. END.

Dear Mr Keenan,

Further to our earlier conversation.

It has been brought to the attention of the Licensing Team that wrestling entertainment is scheduled to take place at the Hairy Dog, Becket Street, Derby, tonight, 2 June, starting at 08.00pm.

We have checked the licensable activities which are permitted by the terms of the Premises Licence in respect of the Hairy Dog and, unfortunately, wrestling is not one of them. I have attached a copy of the Premises Licence for your attention.

Under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003 licensable activities are defined as:

- Sale by retail of alcohol
- Supply of alcohol to a member of a club
- Provision of Regulated Entertainment**
- Provision of Late Night Refreshment

** Regulated Entertainment includes:

- Performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- Indoor sporting events
- Boxing or wrestling entertainment and mixed martial arts
- Live music
- Playing of recorded music
- Performance of dance
- Entertainment of a similar description to that falling within a performance of live music, any playing of recorded music or a performance of dance

As you can see from the above list, "Boxing or wrestling entertainment" is specifically referred to, outside of and separate to "Indoor sporting events".

There are a couple of exemptions for the need to be licensed with regard to wrestling, but these refer only to Greco Roman and Freestyle being performed between 08.00am and 11.00pm in front of an audience of no more than 1000, but both are amateur (Olympic) sports.

I am duty bound to inform you that undertaking an unauthorised licensable activity is an offence under S136 of the Licensing Act 2003:

A person commits an offence if:

- a. He carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation, or;
- b. He knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on

"Authorisation" means:

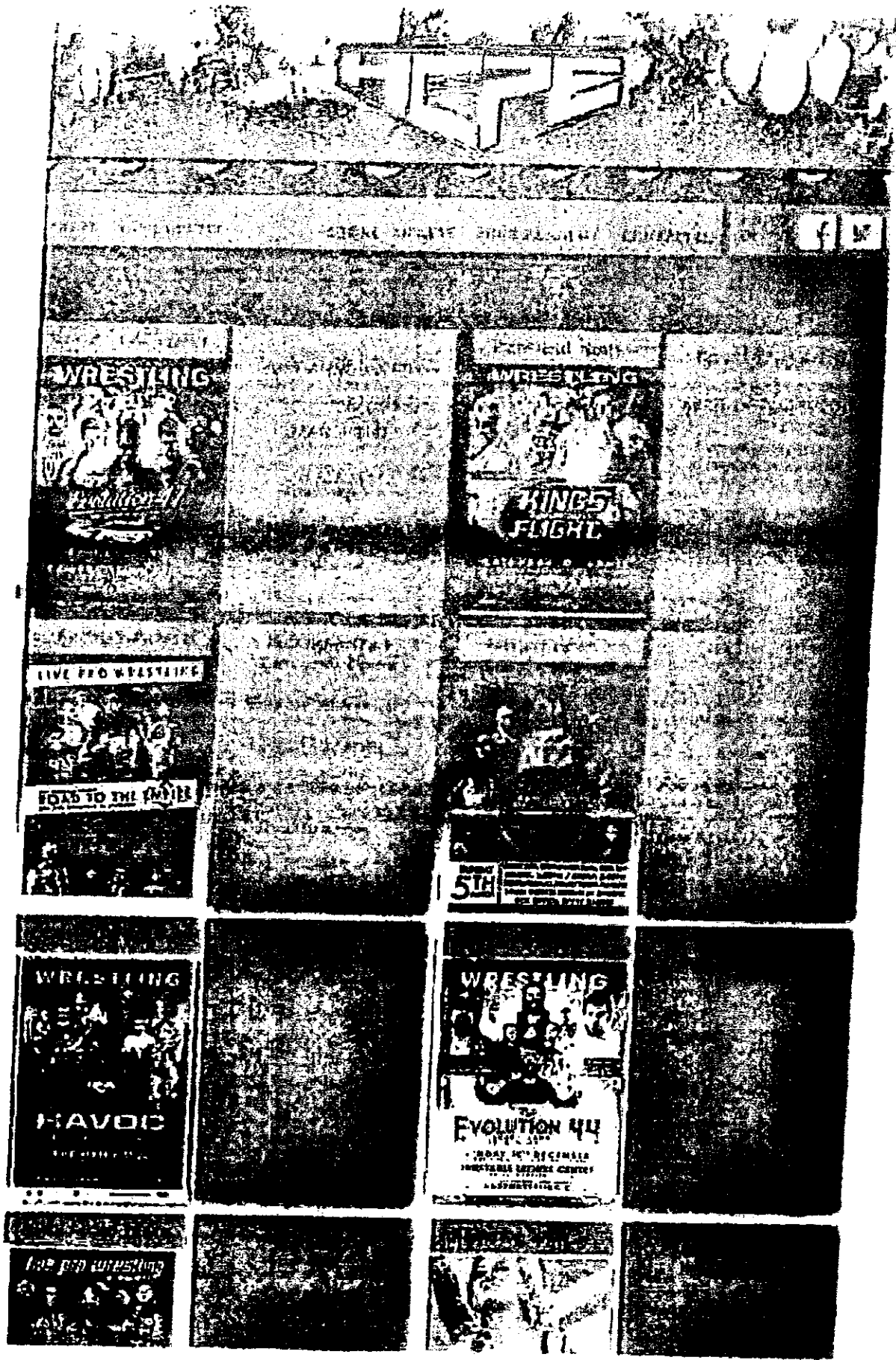
- a. A Premises Licence
- b. A Club Premises Certificate
- c. A Temporary Event Notice

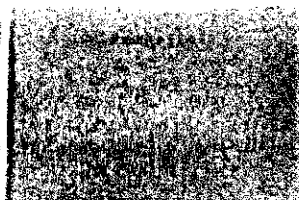
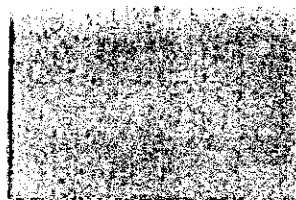
Offenders are liable, on conviction, to an unlimited fine and/or 6 months imprisonment.

ANNEX 1 – MANDATORY CONDITIONS

SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence --
 - a. at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
 - b. at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

DOOR SUPERVISION

3. Each individual required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industries Authority.

MANDATORY CONDITION IMPLEMENTED ON 28 MAY 2014.

- 1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 —
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula — $P = D + (D \times V)$
 Where — P is the permitted price,



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- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014

1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."

(2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially



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similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner).

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either

(a) holographic mark or

(b) an ultraviolet feature

4. The responsible person must ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –



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- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS - EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1 No film shall be exhibited unless:
 - a. it has received a "U", "PG", "12A", "15", or "18" certificate of the British Board of Film Classification; or
 - b. it is a current newsreel, which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.
- 2 **"18" Films**
No person apparently under the age of eighteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 3 **"15" Films**
No person apparently under the age of fifteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "15" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 4 **"12A" Films**
No person apparently under the age of twelve years shall be admitted to any exhibition unless accompanied by an adult at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "12A" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 5 **"PG" Films**
Some scenes contained at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "PG" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, may be unsuitable for young children.



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6 "U" Films

Films suitable for all is any film, which has received a "U", certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

7 Permission of Licensing Authority

Notwithstanding the above, a film may be exhibited, or persons, or any class of person, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are complied with.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS SET BY LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE ON 18/02/16

CONDITIONS RELATING TO CRIME AND DISORDER

- 1) A CCTV system shall be installed and operating at all times. The cameras are to be positioned so as to ensure that all parts of the premises to which the public has access are sufficiently covered (save any toilet areas).
- 2) All recordings will be made in real time and shall be retained for a minimum of 28 days and made available for the view at the reasonable request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within section 13 Licensing Act 2003.
- 3) The recording system is to be secure and maintained in good working order and any faults repaired as soon as possible.

CONDITIONS RELATION TO PUBLIC SAFETY

- 4) An incident log will be maintained at the premises and all relevant incidents recorded within the log. The log will be written, retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5) A written drugs policy will be maintained and adhered to at the premises and be available for



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production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 6) The requirement for SIA registered door supervisors and toilet attendants is to be risk assessed and agreed with the local Police Licensing Department, a copy of the risk assessment is to be provided to the Licensing Authority. Once agreed, the risk assessment may only be amended with the prior written agreement of the local Police Licensing Department.
- 7) A minimum of two door staff will be on duty every Friday and Saturday evening from 21:00 when the premises are open for licensable activities.
- 8) A minimum of two door staff will be on duty at all times when live entertainment is being held at the premises.
- 9) SIA registered door supervisors employed at the premises will wear high visibility jackets/ clothing to distinguish them in their role and make them easily identifiable.
- 10) SIA registered door supervisors shall be equipped with an appropriate method of keeping an accurate record of the capacity levels.
- 11) A daily record of the door supervisors that work at the premises (whether paid or unpaid) will be retained at the premises and will include:
 - start time and finish time of each door supervisor
 - SIA badge number
 - Door supervisor's will sign and print their name in a legible form
 - Each entry will be countersigned by the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 12) The door supervisors log will be retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 The Licensing Act 2003.



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- 13) No customer of the premises shall be allowed to take an alcoholic drink from the premises in an open container unless to an external area set aside for consumption as per the plan.
- 14) The first use of the premises for any of the licensable activities the subject of this grant shall not take place until the Premises Licence Holder deposits with each of the Licensing Authority, Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service and Derbyshire Constabulary, a copy of:
- i. a suitable fire safety risk assessment (which must be approved by the Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service), within which a maximum occupancy figure (to include all personnel employed at the premises by the Premises Licence Holder, any performers engaged for an event on the premises, the event organiser (and any representatives of theirs) and patrons) shall be recorded. It shall also include an assessment of the optimal number of staff to be employed on the premises during the hours when licensable activity is ongoing. For the avoidance of doubt, references to staff exclude those personnel to be employed as door supervisors where a need to employ door supervisors arises;
 - ii. Confirmation of compliance with fire safety regulations.
- 15) The premises shall operate with the dispersal policy which was verified on 19 February 2016.
- 16) Notices must be displayed in the premises in prominent position which warn customers about the need to be aware of pick pockets or bag snatchers, and to guard their property.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO PUBLIC NUISANCE

- 17) No noise from regulated entertainment, including repetitive bass noise, shall be audible from within noise sensitive premises with their windows open in a typical manner for ventilation.
- 18) No amplified music or speech shall be relayed externally via loud speakers other than for events with the prior approval of the Licensing Authority.
- 19) The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events. A record of all complaints and any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a 'complaints logbook' kept specifically for that purpose. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police Officer, or any other authorised person as detailed



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within section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003, upon their request.

- 20) The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall monitor the noise from time to time outside noise sensitive premises, during every event involving amplified music or speech. If as a result of such monitoring, it is considered that the noise levels are excessive, immediate action should be taken to reduce the volume to acceptable levels.
- 21) Sound levels from amplified music shall be set at a level agreed in writing with the Environmental Protection Team, Environment and Regulatory Services, Derby City Council. The agreed level, which will be based on avoidance of noise nuisance to nearby sensitive receptors, shall not be exceeded at any time.
- 22) The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) shall ensure that clear prominent and legible notices must be displayed internally at all exits, requesting customers and other users to leave the premises and the area local to the premises quietly and in an orderly manner respecting the needs of local residents.
- 23) Customers or other users of the premises can only smoke in the designated smoking area agreed and outlined on the submitted plan of the premises.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

- 24) Full training to be provided to all staff on commencement of employment relating to age restricted sales and any systems and procedures that they are expected to follow in the course of age restricted sales will be provided to them.
- 25) Refresher training will be provided every 12 months.
- 26) Records detailing the training provided will be written and retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003.
- 27) A challenge 25 policy/ proof of age scheme will be operated at all times.



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28) Clear signage will be displayed at the entrances/ exits to the premises informing customers of the challenge 25 policy/ proof of age scheme.

29) A system of recording sales refused under the challenge 25/ proof of age scheme shall be operated at all times. The system will be written and retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003.

30) Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

31) No children are permitted on the premises after 20:00 hours

On Friday 1st September 2017 I was on duty at the Council House when I was made aware by my colleague, Ann Walker, that a wrestling event was planned to take place that night at a premises in Derby city centre called the Hairy Dog. The premises are on Beckett Street.

I was aware from a previous issue involving the same premises that, although it held a Premises Licence, the licence in question does not authorize the staging of a wrestling event.

The provision of wrestling entertainment is defined as Regulated Entertainment under the Licensing Act 2003 and has to be authorized by a Premises Licence.

I checked the licence, number PL10551170, in respect of the Hairy Dog and confirmed it does not authorize wrestling entertainment. A copy of the Premises Licence, taken from records held by the Council's Licensing Team, is attached to this statement, marked DB1. I can confirm that, in my position, I am authorized to access the records in question.

I then, at 11.03am on 1 September, sent an email to the email address the Licensing Team has on file for the Hairy Dog; paulhairydogderby@gmail.com

My understanding is that it is the address of Paul Keenan who is specified on the Premises Licence as being the Designated Premises Supervisor. I did not receive any notification that the email had not been delivered. A copy of the email referred to is attached to this statement, marked DB2.

Further to your telephone conversation of approximately 10.20am this morning with my colleague Ann Walker, I can confirm that it has been brought to the attention of Derby City Council's Licensing Team that a wrestling event is scheduled to take place at The Hairy Dog, Beckett Street, Derby, tonight, 1st September 2017.

I am aware that Mrs Walker has advised you that the Premises Licence in respect of The Hairy Dog, number PL10551179, does not authorize such activity.

I had a similar conversation with you on 2 June 2017 with regard to a wrestling event and emailed you the same day to confirm the matter discussed.

We have checked the licensable activities which are permitted by the terms of the Premises Licence in respect of the Hairy Dog and wrestling is not one of them. I have attached a copy of the Premises Licence for your attention

Under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003 licensable activities are defined as:

- Sale by retail of alcohol
- Supply of alcohol to a member of a club
- Provision of Regulated Entertainment**
- Provision of Late Night Refreshment

** Regulated Entertainment includes:

- Performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- Indoor sporting events
- Boxing or wrestling entertainment and mixed martial arts
- Live music
- Playing of recorded music
- Performance of dance
- Entertainment of a similar description to that falling within a performance of live music, any playing of recorded music or a performance of dance

As you can see from the above list, "Boxing or wrestling entertainment" is specifically referred to, outside of and separate to "Indoor sporting events".

There are a couple of exemptions for the need to be licensed with regard to wrestling, but these refer only to Greco Roman and Freestyle being performed between 08.00am and 11.00pm in front of an audience of no more than 1000, but both are amateur (Olympic) sports.

I am duty bound to inform you that undertaking an unauthorised licensable activity is an offence under S136 of the Licensing Act 2003:

A person commits an offence if:

- a. He carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation, or;
- b. He knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on

"Authorisation" means:

- a. A Premises Licence
- b. A Club Premises Certificate
- c. A Temporary Event Notice

Offenders are liable, on conviction, to an unlimited fine and/or 6 months imprisonment.

As the Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of The Hairy Dog, you have a responsibility to ensure the promotion of the Licensing Objectives, which, under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003, are:

- The prevention of crime & disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

I understand the Council is currently in the process of putting together a file with a view to the instigation of formal proceedings in respect of the event which took place on 2 June.

I should make you aware that if a further wrestling event is held at The Hairy Dog, further action may be taken.

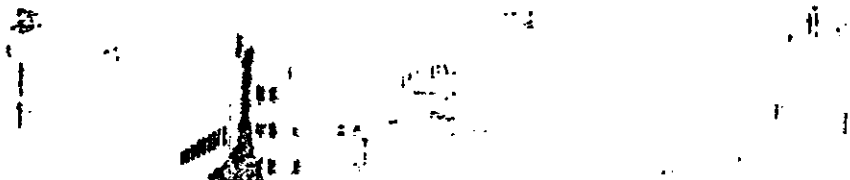

At approximately 1415 hours on FRIDAY 2ND JUNE 2017 I received an email from Derby City Council regarding an event that was being held at the HAIRY DOG, BECKET STREET DERBY at 2000 hours on the same date. This event was a live wrestling event and after checking the premises licence for the HAIRY DOG it appeared that it was not authorised to hold such an event. At that time I called Paul KEENAN the Designated Premises Supervisor to inform him that the event could not go ahead as there was no temporary event notice in place either.

He did not answer the phone call but I then called him again around 1445 hours and this time he did answer. I advised him that I have become aware of the event and that his licence said that he wasn't authorised for live wrestling. His reply was that he was trying to get hold of a solicitor to get advice but he was struggling as it was a Friday afternoon. He said that he had indoor sporting events on the premises licence and this should cover it. I advised him that wrestling and boxing were not covered by this and had to be applied for separately. He said the event had been booked for 6 months and he didn't understand why this had been picked up now as it would be costly to the organisers. I sympathised with his predicament but then told him that if he allowed the event to go ahead he could be dealt with for breaching the licence conditions or face prosecution.

The conversation ended with him saying he was going to wait for a solicitor to get back to him to advise him.

A presenter entered the rink, introducing the event on a microphone, an umpire in striped top entered the rink and the first wrestler entered the ring. I left at around 8:30. During my conversation with Paul Keenan I was informed that he was expecting up to 150 people, the fire exits were clear and he had 4 security personnel present. He described the event to me as a freestyle wrestling event. End

I am a Licensing Enforcement Officer for the 'South' Division of the Derbyshire Constabulary and I am currently stationed in the Licensing Section at St Mary's Wharf, Prime Parkway, Derby.

I am currently responsible for licensing enforcement matters on behalf of the Derbyshire Constabulary for those premises, within the 'South' Division, licensed under The Licensing Act 2003.

At 22:30 hours on Friday 2nd June 2017 I attended The Hairy Dog, Beckett Street, Derby, along with Pc 2942 Pilkington.

On my arrival I spoke with the current Designated Premise Supervisor, Paul Keenan. I entered the Premises which was open to the public and licensable activity was taking place. The bar was open and alcohol was being served. I then went to the rear event room. On my arrival I noted that there was a wrestling event on. A ring had been erected and a bout was in progress. A number of people were watching the event which had door staff at the internal door monitoring entry.

Prior to entering the room Mr Keenan stated that should council officials had already been to the Premises and said "It's in my licence it's covered"

I informed him that I was attending because his current licence did not allow boxing or wrestling to take place as a licensable activity. By allowing it to take place he was committing an offence under section 136 of the Licensing Act.

He denied this stating that he licence allowed for the 'performance of indoor sporting events' and he took this to include wrestling. The licence does not say 'excluding wrestling and boxing'

He admitted that he had been contacted by the Police Licensing department and Derby City Licensing department earlier that day to inform him that his licence did not cover this activity.

He stated he had not been able to contact his solicitor and had made a judgement call to let the event go ahead. It had been organised for six months

He said "My licence said it was a licensable activity and the council told me it wasn't" "If the council can't write their licenses properly that's not my issue"

He had disregarded the calls made from the Licensing Authority and would be happy to go to court to argue the matter.

I entered the room where the wrestling bout was taking place. Two males were inside the ring and the bout was ongoing. Members of the public were consuming alcohol whilst watching the event.

Whilst in the room I was approached by a male who introduced himself as the promoter. He gave his details as a Dale Harvey of Hope Wrestling.

Mr Harvey said the event was classified as 'freestyle wrestling' and that he held events at other venues. He did state that these had been covered by Temporary Event Notices.

The Premises was open for licensable activity and the wrestling was taking place and this was unauthorised licensable activity.

During my visit my bodycam was recording the events within the Premises.

I am authorised by the Council under the Licensing Act 2003 (the Act). Part of my role and responsibilities is carrying out enforcement work under the Act and identifying and dealing with any unlicensed activity. On 1 September 2017 at approximately 10:05hrs I received a telephone call informing me there was to be 'pro-wrestling' entertainment at the Hairy Dog on Becket Street, Derby later that evening. I examined the Council's licensing records to check the current premises licence, and also to see if a temporary event notice had been submitted to cover this entertainment. The Licensing Team had received an application for a premises licence from HKB ENTERPRISES LTD for the Hairy Dog on 27 October 2015. The application was for the sale of alcohol on & off the premises, late night refreshment and regulated entertainment, but the box indicating boxing or wrestling had not been ticked. licensable activities applied for, but omitted boxing and wrestling as a licensed activity on the licence. I did not find a temporary event notice in place for the advertised event. I searched the Internet and Facebook for evidence of the event taking place. On Facebook I found reference to Hope Wrestling who was promoting an event on 1 September 2017 at the Hairy Dog. I took some screenshots and these are produced as evidence as AW/2. On the Council records there was a contact number for the premises. I phoned the number at approximately 10:20hrs and spoke to PAUL KEENAN, who I know to be the designated premises supervisor. He confirmed the event was due to take place later that evening. The premises licence currently held by HKB ENTERPRISES LTD, whose director is HELEN KATHERINE BUTLER, who has attended previous licensing hearings at the Council Offices, and who was introduced at that time as the partner of Mr PAUL KEENAN. I explained the licence did not include the authorisation to hold wrestling events at the Hairy Dog and he faced prosecution. He said he had been waiting for information from the Council in respect of a previous wrestling event held in June, and as he had not received had any correspondence, he thought he was okay to go ahead. I reminded Mr KEENAN that he had already been told by another officer from the Licensing Team that his licence did not cover wrestling entertainment at the time of the earlier event, and that a prosecution file was being compiled. This information had also been sent in June by email to the address we had on record – paulhairydogderby@gmail.com. He went on to say he thought it was covered by 'indoor sports' that was on his

licence. I reminded him that 'boxing and wrestling' are a specific licensable activity under the Licensing Act 2003 and must show on the licence. Mr KEENAN countered this by saying it wasn't specifically excluded from his licence. I then stated the premises licence lists what is covered and not what is excluded. Mr KEENAN said the wrestling was a bit like a play and it was like a comedy. When I asked, had he not thought of submitting a temporary event notice (TEN) to cover the event, he said he had, but then his mum had become ill and he missed the 10 day deadline. When I mentioned the possibility of submitting a late TEN up to 5 working days before the event, Mr KEENAN said, there was no point him putting in a late TEN as the Police would always object and the event couldn't then go ahead. He went on to say he would lose money and upset the organiser if he cancelled at this stage. I contacted the Licensing Team at the Derbyshire Constabulary to see if any officer was due to be working on the Night Time Economy that evening, and was told PC DUNN was due to be working and PC PATERNOSTER said he would ask him to call into the venue. On 9 October 2017, I was made aware that my colleague, Sandra Mansell had made contact with Mr PAUL KEENAN and had sent a letter dated 14 September 2017 to HKB ENTERPRISES LTD regarding a wrestling event planned for 6 October 2017. A copy can be found as Exhibit AW/3. I was also made aware of a late TEN submitted by Mr PAUL KEENAN on 26 September 2017 for the event on 6 October 2017. Derbyshire Constabulary objected to the TEN and a counter notice was served. A copy of the notice can be found as Exhibit AW/4. END

At 22:25 on Friday 1st September 2017, I was on duty in full police uniform, working in Derby City Centre as part of the NTE transit deployment in my role as a Licensing Officer.

Due to information previously passed to me regarding the possibility of unauthorised licensable activities taking place, I had cause to visit premises known as "The Hairy Dog" situated on Becket Street in Derby.

At this time I was in the company of DS Dan Burns.

I parked the marked police vehicle on Bramble Street and walked towards Becket Street, at the end of Bramble Street I saw a large white van parked up at the side of the road. On the near side of the van I saw the words "Lincolnshire Fight Factory" there was also a web address and contact number, www.lincwrestling.co.uk "07517 508389".

At 22:28 I arrived at the Hairy Dog, I saw two door staff at the entrance, I asked if the DPS Paul Keenan was available, I was told that he was not and that the person in charge is "Nick".

I entered the premises and was led to the rear function room by a member of the security staff, when the doors opened into the back function room; I saw a group of people surrounding a boxing/wrestling ring. There was a referee in the ring and two people wrestling, I have seen wrestling events before and I have no doubt that the event taking place before me was "wrestling" and as such requires specific authorisation by way of a Premise Licence, Club Certificate or a Temporary Event Notice (TEN).

As I entered the room, on my right standing near to the door I saw a bare chested male, without prompt he explained that he was a "wrestler" and he had not longed finished his fight and that was the reason he was not wearing a shirt.

Nick May b.26/01/1989 (Tel 07932 096464) walked me through the premises and identified the fire exits, he also provided the premises licence and a list of names authorised to sell alcohol, the authorisation was signed by Paul Keenan.

Mr May told me that the DPS Paul Keenan had told him to expect a visit from the licensing department but had reassured Mr May that the wrestling event was an authorised event, he then pointed out to me

on the premises licence under the section headed "Licenseable activities authorised by the licence" "performance of indoor sporting events" I explained that Boxing and Wrestling are sporting events that require specific authority and that Mr Keenan has been made fully aware of this by the licensing authority and the police. I went on to explain that offences under the licensing act were taking place namely section 136 of the act which covers unauthorised licenseable activities. I explained that by allowing the activity to carry on he may be committing an offence and could be prosecuted if found guilty.

I told Mr May that I believed the DPS Mr Keenan was responsible as he had the overall day to day control of the premises; I explained that I was disappointed that he was not at the premises to explain himself. Mr May tried to contact Keenan on his mobile phone at 22:35, the call transferred to the answered machine.

I asked Mr May how long the event had left to run before it was finished, I was told it was the last bout and would be over within 20 minutes. Due to the disruption and possible potential for disorder, I told Mr May that whilst I cannot condone the event, I would not insist at this time for him to stop the event but warned that whilst it continued offences were occurring.

I gave Mr May my contact details and asked that he pass them to the DPS Paul Keenan with a message for him to contact me on Tuesday 5th September to discuss the issues further.

At the time of making this statement I have had no contact from Paul Keenan or indeed any representative from the Hairy Dog.

Further to this statement I am making available video footage of this visit.

I am trained in the use of a Reveal RS2-X3 Body Worn Video Camera and I have my own personal issue camera bearing the serial number 35710. This camera bears an identifying label with this serial number and also my collar number 2013.

On Friday 1st September at 2100 hrs (time A) at St Marys Wharf Police Station I commenced my shift and collected my equipment which is booked out to me. I was working as a Licensing Officer and my call sign being DY7.

On Friday 1st September 2017 at 22:26:59 hrs (time B) at Bramble Street Derby I commenced recording.

On Friday 1st September 2017 at 22:44:31 hrs (time C) at The Hairy Dog on Becket Street Derby I concluded recording.

On Saturday 2nd September 2017 at 06:10 hrs (time D) at St Marys Wharf I docked my camera and downloaded footage recorded as just stated. A master copy was created and retained in secure storage. There is no facility in place to allow me to edit, amend or delete the footage recorded on the actual camera and the master copy contains all the footage recorded. There is no removable storage cards/media in the camera. The device is sealed.





On Friday 6th October 2017 I was on duty in full uniform. At approximately 21:33hrs on the same day I attended THE HAIRY DOG public house on BECKETT STREET, DERBY, in company with PS 3078 ABBOTT. We attended the venue following information having been received that an unlicensed wrestling event was taking place and we were tasked with ascertaining whether there was in fact a wrestling event taking place and to obtain further information about it.

At 21:33hrs on 06/10/2017 I parked our marked Police vehicle on BECKETT Street and activated my Body Worn Video camera. PS ABBOTT and I made our way to the HAIRY DOG and saw a white coloured van, registration KL55KTX parked on the corner of BRAMBLE STREET, close to the junction with BECKETT STREET. On the front and side of the van were the words: "LINCOLN FIGHT FACTORY WRESTLING".

Once we arrived at the front entrance to the HAIRY DOG I spoke with a member of door staff who advised me that the licensee of the pub, Mr Paul KEENAN was present and that he was in charge that evening. I asked the member of door staff how many people were currently inside the premises and was told that there were one hundred and four people inside but that the maximum capacity for the venue is four hundred. Paul KEENAN later told me that the regular maximum capacity is four hundred and sixty but that they had decided to limit the capacity to two hundred people that night due to the amount of space being occupied by the wrestling ring which had been erected in the rear function room area. Mr KEENAN showed PS ABBOTT and I around the HAIRY DOG. In the rear function room a staged wrestling match between two adult male performers was taking place at the time of our visit. Mr KEENAN identified the various fire escapes within the venue and that each of them were well lit and unlocked. Mr KEENAN also showed us to the upstairs function room, which at the time of our visit was not in use, with no members of staff or the public in there. We were told that the room is used as a café.

On arrival at the front door to the HAIRY DOG PC Murphy spoke with the door staff who told him the licensee of the pub was a Mr Paul KEENAN and that he was in charge of the event.

Door staff confirmed there were one hundred and four people inside, but the maximum capacity for the venue was four hundred, this was later confirmed as four hundred and sixty by Mr KEENAN.

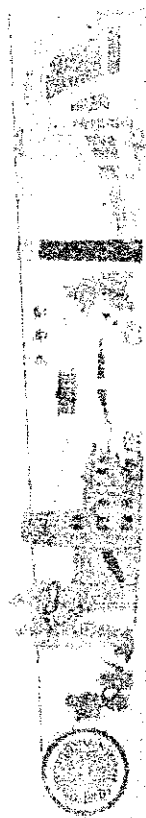

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

DOOR SUPERVISION

3. Each individual required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industries Authority.

MANDATORY CONDITION IMPLEMENTED ON 28 MAY 2014.

- 1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 –
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula — $P = D + (D \times V)$Where — P is the permitted price,



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(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014

1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."

(2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially



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similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner).

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either

(a) holographic mark or

(b) an ultraviolet feature

4. The responsible person must ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –

- 4 "12A" Films
No person apparently under the age of twelve years shall be admitted to any exhibition unless accompanied by an adult at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "12A" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 5 "PG" Films
Some scenes contained at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "PG" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, may be unsuitable for young children.

6 "U" Films
Films suitable for all is any film, which has received a "U", certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

7 Permission of Licensing Authority
Notwithstanding the above, a film may be exhibited, or persons, or any class of person, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are complied with.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO CRIME AND DISORDER

- 1) A CCTV system shall be installed and operating at all times. The cameras are to be positioned so as to ensure that all parts of the premises to which the public has access are sufficiently covered (save any toilet areas).
- 2) All recordings will be made in real time and shall be retained for a minimum of 28 days and made available for the view at the reasonable request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within section 13 Licensing Act 2003.
- 3) The recording system is to be secure and maintained in good working order and any faults repaired as soon as possible.

CONDITIONS RELATION TO PUBLIC SAFETY

- 4) An incident log will be maintained at the premises and all relevant incidents recorded within the log. The log will be written, retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5) A written drugs policy will be maintained and adhered to at the premises and be available for



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production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 6) The requirement for SIA registered door supervisors and toilet attendants is to be risk assessed and agreed with the local Police Licensing Department, a copy of the risk assessment is to be provided to the Licensing Authority. Once agreed, the risk assessment may only be amended with the prior written agreement of the local Police Licensing Department.
- 7) A minimum of two door staff will be on duty every Friday and Saturday evening from 21:00 when the premises are open for licensable activities.
- 8) A minimum of two door staff will be on duty at all times when live entertainment is being held at the premises.
- 9) SIA registered door supervisors employed at the premises will wear high visibility jackets/ clothing to distinguish them in their role and make them easily identifiable.
- 10) SIA registered door supervisors shall be equipped with an appropriate method of keeping an accurate record of the capacity levels.
- 11) A daily record of the door supervisors that work at the premises (whether paid or unpaid) will be retained at the premises and will include:
 - start time and finish time of each door supervisor
 - SIA badge number
 - Door supervisor's will sign and print their name in a legible form
 - Each entry will be countersigned by the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 12) The door supervisors log will be retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 The Licensing Act 2003.



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- 13) No customer of the premises shall be allowed to take an alcoholic drink from the premises in an open container unless to an external area set aside for consumption as per the plan.
- 14) The first use of the premises for any of the licensable activities the subject of this grant shall not take place until the Premises Licence Holder deposits with each of the Licensing Authority, Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service and Derbyshire Constabulary, a copy of:
- i. a suitable fire safety risk assessment (which must be approved by the Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service), within which a maximum occupancy figure (to include all personnel employed at the premises by the Premises Licence Holder, any performers engaged for an event on the premises, the event organiser (and any representatives of theirs) and patrons) shall be recorded. It shall also include an assessment of the optimal number of staff to be employed on the premises during the hours when licensable activity is ongoing. For the avoidance of doubt, references to staff exclude those personnel to be employed as door supervisors where a need to employ door supervisors arises;
 - ii. Confirmation of compliance with fire safety regulations.
- 15) The premises shall operate with the dispersal policy which was verified on 19 February 2016.
- 16) Notices must be displayed in the premises in prominent position which warn customers about the need to be aware of pick pockets or bag snatchers, and to guard their property.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO PUBLIC NUISANCE

- 17) No noise from regulated entertainment, including repetitive bass noise, shall be audible from within noise sensitive premises with their windows open in a typical manner for ventilation.
- 18) No amplified music or speech shall be relayed externally via loud speakers other than for events with the prior approval of the Licensing Authority.
- 19) The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events. A record of all complaints and any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a "complaints logbook" kept specifically for that purpose. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police Officer, or any other authorised person as detailed



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within section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003, upon their request.

- 20) The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall monitor the noise from time to time outside noise sensitive premises, during every event involving amplified music or speech. If as a result of such monitoring, it is considered that the noise levels are excessive, immediate action should be taken to reduce the volume to acceptable levels.
- 21) Sound levels from amplified music shall be set at a level agreed in writing with the Environmental Protection Team, Environment and Regulatory Services, Derby City Council. The agreed level, which will be based on avoidance of noise nuisance to nearby sensitive receptors, shall not be exceeded at any time.
- 22) The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) shall ensure that clear prominent and legible notices must be displayed internally at all exits, requesting customers and other users to leave the premises and the area local to the premises quietly and in an orderly manner respecting the needs of local residents.
- 23) Customers or other users of the premises can only smoke in the designated smoking area agreed and outlined on the submitted plan of the premises.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

- 24) Full training to be provided to all staff on commencement of employment relating to age restricted sales and any systems and procedures that they are expected to follow in the course of age restricted sales will be provided to them.
- 25) Refresher training will be provided every 12 months.
- 26) Records detailing the training provided will be written and retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003.
- 27) A challenge 25 policy/ proof of age scheme will be operated at all times.



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- 28) Clear signage will be displayed at the entrances/ exits to the premises informing customers of the challenge 25 policy/ proof of age scheme.
- 29) A system of recording sales refused under the challenge 25/ proof of age scheme shall be operated at all times. This statement is made regarding the Premises Licence for The Hairy Dog Premises Licence Number PL10551179. *(Attached to bundle Page 5 – 22)*

The Hairy Dog – 1-7 Becket Street, Derby, Derbyshire, is located in Derby City Centre which is situated in the Derby North Section (DN) of the Division and is within the Derby City Council area. Derby City Council is the Licensing Authority for these premises.

On the 1st June 2018 representation by way of review was applied for on behalf of the Derby City Licensing Authority. The Licensing Authority state that they have "serious concerns with the company's inability, or unwillingness to comply with the legislation".

At this time the Police as a responsible authority under section 13(4) of the Licensing Act 2003, were invited to make their own representations. The Chief Officer of Police is making formal representation against the premises licence and offers information to the Licensing committee to help make a balanced and informed decision.

In the early hours of Sunday morning the 15th April 2018, the Police were made aware of an incident that was occurring outside of The Hairy Dog on Becket Street. The incident logged has a reference number 145-150418 and was initiated at 02:24 am. Copy attached to bundle. *(Control Works incident - Attached to bundle Page 153 –156)*

The incident reported a large fight involving over half a dozen people, on police arrival three people were known to be injured and a fourth person being a door security guard had been rendered unconscious but was back on his feet and not wanting to register a complaint with the police.

Police did all that they could on arrival to calm the situation down and prevent any further disorder. Already on the scene were the "Street Pastors" these are trained volunteers from local churches who do a great service for those who find themselves in difficult or vulnerable circumstances on nights out in Derby particularly over the weekends.

The Street Pastors were tending to two injured people and had already called an ambulance before the police arrived.

The scene was one of disorder and confusion with people milling around, one male had broken hand, and others were lying on the road with unknown injuries.

The premises were still open for licensable activities at this time, I asked the door staff when the premises would close and I was told at 03:00 they would start emptying the premises.

Two males had been arrested for suspicion of committing assault; it was therefore imperative that the CCTV was requested and obtained from staff in an effort to help identify the offenders and hopefully show what had occurred and secure a charge.

The CCTV was not made readily available on request by officers on the night in question; this obviously frustrates any enquiry into offences committed. Officers did make a request to view the footage on screen and record it on their body worn cameras, this would have been sufficient until such time an original hard copy could be produced in full. Again it appeared that no one at the premises had the training to operate the system and show officers the footage that had been recorded, one of the door supervisors said *"I've asked the question (about if the video could be viewed), nobody knows what the hell they're doing with it."* This is a concern as condition number 2 Annex 3 on the licence set by the licensing sub-committee on 19/02/16 states;

"All recordings will be made in real time and shall be retained for a minimum of 28 days and made available for the view at the reasonable request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within section 13 Licensing Act 2003." (Attached to bundle Page 13)

Due to the lack of independent witnesses or anyone willing to register a complaint, the males pointed out as being involved with this incident and that had been subsequently arrested, were released without charge pending any further information coming to light.

I spoke to the door staff in charge, and asked that he speak to Mr Paul Keenan the DPS and request that a copy of the footage be made available for collection on the Monday morning. I also left a request that he contact the licensing department as soon as possible to discuss this incident. No contact has been initiated with this department from Mr Keenan since this incident occurred.

Due to a lack of contact with the premises, a visit by officers was made to The Hairy Dog on 17/04/18 to ask for the footage requested on the night of the incident. This footage and a written documentary forms part of this submission and is contained within this bundle. (Statement PC Suiter - Attached to bundle Page 43-44)

From accounts of witnesses at the scene, including a statement from a street pastor, I would categorise this incident as being "serious disorder" and the people involved were committing at least an "Affray".

A "Street Pastors" report read. *(Report from Richard Wormsley-Attached to bundle Page 51)*

"At 2-30am we were on the Wardwick when we noticed a big fight starting outside the Hairy Dog. There were at least 7 or 8 fighting including 4 skinheads. I immediately called CCTV and for the police, but as at least two of the men were on the ground getting a severe kicking, and no police were there, I personally intervened to try and distract them as my initial thought was the serious injuries that could have been inflicted. In hindsight it was not the wisest thing to do as I was putting myself in danger and also compromising the safety of the rest of the team. When the police arrived, there were three men on the ground and we quickly had to assess how to deal with them. Helene went to one who was conscious and a minor head wound, Shirley and David to one who was semi-conscious and I to another who was conscious and no external injuries. He quickly got up and was handled by the police. After checking with the others on the condition of their casualty I called an ambulance. Fortunately, because I was in a call queue when I did get through I was told that someone had already registered the incident. The paramedics had a quick look at Helene's casualty and chose not to do anything as he was stood up and only had a small wound to his forehead. The other casualty was taken into the ambulance for assessment. The overall outcome was that no one was arrested as it was not clear what had provoked the fight and no one was willing to make any accusations against anyone else."

CCTV footage from the premises shows males being escorted out of the bar area, when out of the front door an altercation takes place, due to the positioning of the cameras it is unclear what occurred at the front of the premises on the road outside. What can be established when viewing from the footage is that a person can be seen falling to the floor apparently unconscious, he was then left lying there whilst disorder takes place around him. It was later disclosed that the individual was a member of the door team and he had been assaulted by way of a punch to the head.

Initially it was difficult to establish from the footage that he was a member of the door team, as he was not wearing a high visibility jacket as required by a condition attached to the licence.

I have checked the signing in register for that night and the door staff in question was booked on duty and employed in the capacity as a door supervisor.

Although it would appear that the door supervisor was subject to an assault which could have resulted as being far more serious, no official complaint was received from the individual or any comment made by the Management of the premises.

Some days later on 4th May 2018 a concerned member of the public called the police switch board and alerted the police to footage of this incident which had been uploaded on to social media. The "open source" footage highlights the extent of the disorder taking place outside of the venue. It shows door staff and customers involved in a violent altercation. I can say that from the people involved in the footage and comparing it to the images from the venues

internal CCTV, I can confirm that this is the same incident that occurred in the early hours of Sunday 15th April. Having pieced together the events of that evening from all of the sources available, I have reservations on how the incident was initially dealt with by door staff and subsequently the lack of concern shown by the Management of the premises.

When reviewing the footage it is clear that someone is on the ground with people continually punching him, there is no intervention from door staff at this time to assist in anyway the individual concerned. Staff could and should have called the police to assist and prevent the incident from escalating.

Other people are seen leaving the front of the venue getting actively involved with the disorder happening on the road, door staff are seen to throw punches at people and one is seen to kick out at someone who is lying on the floor.

The actions of the door staff were somewhat excessive and overzealous, rather than calming the situation down they seemed to aggravate what was already a volatile situation.

If it was not for the street pastors passing and intervening when they did, injuries could have been more of a concern and the police may never have been made aware of this incident.

After reviewing all of the footage, there was sufficient evidence for police to further investigate this incident. This is now subject to a live investigation and any offences shall be dealt with accordingly and any offenders charged as appropriate.

The footage from social media and the footage taken from the internal CCTV system are attached to this bundle along with a written time line.

(Statement of PC Gareth Fowler - Attached to bundle Page 37-40)

I can confirm that the premises remained open during this incident, loud music continued to play inside, alcohol was sold and consumed. People that had been involved in the disorder were allowed back into the venue without any challenge. I pointed this out to the door staff but no regard was taken to my comments. A "Dispersal Policy" agreed 19/02/16 (*Attached to bundle Page 79-80*) was not being adhered to. As I walked through I witnessed loud amplified music still playing in the function room, this should have stopped at 02.00 am.

On viewing the incident log at the premises some days later, I saw that the incident was recorded in the premises incident book and reads as follows;

"Group removed by pool table for creating a nuisance. Broke out in fight whilst being ejected. Doorman knocked out police arrived on scene."

No other details were made that would help to build a due diligence defence. The door staff that sustained the injury should at the very least have been checked by paramedics and been offered some first aid provision.

An ambulance called by the Street Pastors arrived at the scene and after providing care and advice took one of the casualties to hospital for further examination for the injuries sustained; this should possibly have been reported as an incident at work "RIDDOR".

(EMAS Log Attached to bundle Page 73)

RIDDOR is the law that requires employers, and other people in control of work premises, to report and keep records of work-related accidents which cause certain serious injuries (reportable injuries). For the purposes of RIDDOR, an accident is a separate, identifiable, unintended incident that causes physical injury. This specifically includes acts of non-consensual violence to people at work. The door staff involved with this incident was knocked unconscious and therefore had sustained a "specified injury".

Work-related accidents involving members of the public or people who are not at work must be reported if a person is injured, and is taken from the scene of the accident to hospital for treatment to that injury. Again a report should have been made for the person taken to hospital. This is not covered by the Licensing Act but is covered by Health and Safety at Work which should be adhered to.

Concerns have also been raised about the door staff at the premises being employed legitimately. On Friday 23rd March 2018 I conducted a number of SIA door staff checks with Indarjit Singh an Investigations Officer from the Security Industry Authority, we covered most of Derby City Centre taking details and giving advice to door staff. In the early hours of Saturday 24th we spoke to two door staff on duty at the Hairy Dog they said that they were both employed "in house" by the company. They later went on to say that they were both self-employed and invoiced Mr Keenan for their services.

For clarity, if you manage, supervise and / or are the employer of individuals who engage in licensable activity, but you do not personally carry out the front line activity at any time, then you need a non-front line licence.

Having made enquiries with the SIA I can confirm that Mr. Paul Keenan does not hold a "front line" or "non-front line" licence allowing him to employ door staff who engage in licensable activities, he maybe therefore committing offences under "The Private Security Industry Act 2001"

Mr Keenan has been told in the past that he has a legal obligation to have the correct licence to have authorisation to deploy SIA badged door supervisors. It was mentioned at hearings in 2012 and again in 2016. In her closing statement Del Crisp a solicitor representing the police said

- 96 *At a previous licensing hearing (2nd July 2012, page 30 Police bundle), Mr. Keenan previously claimed to hold SIA status and be a licenced badge holder before a previous panel hearing.*
- 97 *Rachel Fox informed PC Dunn on 9th July that there was no trace of Mr Keenan on the system and he was not a registered or licenced SIA badge holder.*
- 98 *He told us during this hearing that he used to be a licence holder many years ago, but he has produced no evidence of this.*

Indarjit Singh also confirms that Mr Keenan does not hold a valid licence, in his statement attached to this bundle. He states, *"I can confirm that Paul Douglas Keenan 08/12/1966 does not hold a valid SIA licence. I can also confirm that he has not held an SIA or have an active application for a licence."*

(Statement from Indarjit Singh SIA - Attached to bundle Page 75-76)

At the time of the incident on 15th April this year, Mr Keenan was not present, but he should have appointed a manager who was fully trained and competent to operate the premises in a way that promotes the licensing objectives.

It is apparent that Mr Paul Keenan is in sole charge of the running of these premises and there is no input at all from the Premises Licence Holder Ms Butler, an email from Ms Butler's legal representative "Licensing Solutions" in 2015 explains in detail Helen Butler's involvement with the running of the Hairy Dog. It also details the full extent of Paul Keenan's control and influence in running the venue.

Gill Sherratt states *"As you are aware Helen Butler is the sole Director of HKB Enterprises the Premises Licence Holders. However, Helen does not have any active role or part in the running of this business. As you are already aware the business is run and managed entirely by Paul Keenan and he is the person responsible for conducting the licensable activities. The structure of the operations and all management decisions are made by him."*

(A copy of the email from Gill Sherratt - Attached to bundle Page 77-78)

The incident on the 15th April this year is on its own merit worthy of consideration of a review application. Consideration was given by the Chief Officer of Police to an expedited review under section 53a of The Act. However due to the lack of evidence and full circumstances immediately available at the time of this incident and the obvious requirement for further investigations, it was decided more prudent to wait until the final outcome of the Court proceedings scheduled for 3rd May 2018. It was not until the social media footage came to light, that the full extent of the disorder was known and by this time Mr. Keenan had pleaded guilty at Court to committing offences under The Act. I was also made aware at this time that a review by the Licensing Authority was being strongly considered.

The police have had concerns about Mr Keenan and his lack of willingness to work with the responsible authorities going back several years.

The report below outlines some of the interaction that the police have had with Mr Keenan since his involvement with the Hairy Dog. It hopes to highlight to the Sub-Committee the concerns that the police have regarding his ability to promote the licensing objectives and the lack of trust in his integrity as an operator.

In April 2012 a meeting was held with Mr Keenan to explain to him the concerns that the police had with him being involved with any licensed premises. He was told at this meeting that if he were to apply to become a DPS at another venue the police would have serious reservations and would object to any application made.

(Statement from Sgt Lomas (Retired) - Attached to bundle Page 81-85)

Mr Keenan disregarded all advice given to him at this meeting and still applied to become the DPS of the Hairy Dog, prompting an objection by the police which was submitted with documentary evidence to the Licensing Sub Committee in June 2012. The sub-committee having heard all the evidence from both sides in a hearing, found against Mr Keenan, issuing the decision notice on 2nd July 2012. *(Decision Notice - Attached to bundle Page 87-90)*

Mr Keenan was spoken to by officers from the police licensing department in May and June 2012 *(Visit reports - Attached to bundle Page 97 – 99)*. It was found at this time that even with all the advice he had previously received whilst at the Old Bell Hotel and his experiences with those premises, he still was not promoting the licensing objectives and did not have even the basic documentation in place and was not aware of the conditions set out on the premises licence.

In July 2012 after a section 19 closure order was issued to Mr Keenan at the premises, a variation was received from Poppleston Allen solicitors representing Mr Keenan. The variation was to submit an up to date plan of the premises, add conditions and install Carrie Siddall as DPS.

Although the police had several meetings with Carrie Siddall the DPS giving her advice and support, it was not long before issues again became apparent and officers were required to attend the premises for licensing matters and give the DPS and Mr Keenan suitable advice. It was obvious that the conditions agreed on the variation were not being adhered to and there was no control of people entering the premises. Although capacity limits were enforced, 60 on the first floor and 100 in the lower, there were no legitimate measures in place to control such numbers. Police had asked the door staff on at least two different occasions to provide evidence to prove the premises were not over capacity and therefore not causing a public safety issue. On both occasions door staff admitted to not having any means to control numbers other than a quick head count and were unable to tell police how many people were in the building.

On 23rd May 2012 Mr Keenan contacted the police complaining about an article in the Derby Telegraph stating that he did not have a current music licence, Keenan disputed this. He told the police that he had a current licence and the relevant authority was mistaken. Keenan was advised not to play any recorded music until such times as he could prove that he was licensed to do so, although it was not a Licensing matter as such, it was explained that it would reflect on him in a negative way should it be found he is acting unlawfully. After further investigation I received an Email on 13 June 2012 from Gail Fox a Music Licensing Advisor from the Performing Rights Society, she confirmed that Mr Keenan had not got a PRS for music licence and would deal with the premises accordingly. (*email from Gayle Fox - Attached to bundle Page 91*).

In February 2014 Mr Keenan was again given advice by the Licensing Sergeant Mark Lomas, about an incident involving drugs at the premises. Mr Keenan said that a male and a female were ejected from the premises and the drugs confiscated were disposed of. When asked why the police were not called to this incident Mr Keenan said that the door staff took it on himself to dispose of the drugs, which in his opinion only amounted to personal use and he "didn't think it worthy of police time". It was explained to Mr Keenan that he should have a drugs policy in place as stated in a condition on his premises licence and he should have recorded this incident in a log book again as stated in a condition on the licence. Mr Keenan was advised about not having a drugs policy and the promotion of the licensing objectives.

On 16th May 2015, I attended the Hairy Dog due to the extremely loud noise emanating from the premises; this noise could be heard on Beckett Street at the junction of Bramble Street.

On arrival Mr Keenan was told about the excessive noise and asked to be present whilst a licensing inspection was undertaken. I was concerned at the amount of infringements found at the premises; even the most basic of requirements were not being evidenced. The correct license was not produced on request and the premises summary was not on display as required by the Licensing Act. Other infringements were noted (*Visit Ref:VID 14231 - Attached to bundle Page 101*) and an explanation was requested from Mr Keenan. He stated on this occasion that all of the relevant logs and documentation were in place but due to suffering from a bad back he couldn't go up the stairs to find them for production. I reminded Mr Keenan of a letter issued to him on 2nd April 2015 (*Attached to bundle Page 93-96*) warning of a possible review of the premises. It was apparent from this visit that Mr Keenan was continuing to disregard the licensing objectives as nothing was produced or offered to give him any sort of due diligence defence.

On 14th September 2015 PC Day attended the premises and issued an infringement notice (*Attached to bundle Page 103*) to Mr Keenan after undertaking a basic licensing check. Breaches were still being found even after all the advice and interaction with the premises.

The following week PC Hannah attended the premises as part of an arranged SIA operation in Derby City Centre. At the time of the visit the premises licence required two door staff to be on duty. Only one door staff was checked to be at the premises during this inspection. Mr

Keenan had breached conditions that are clear and enforceable again putting in doubt his ability to promote the licensing objectives.

On 1st October 2016 I attended the premises whilst on night time economy (NTE) patrol. Public safety was a concern, over capacity and blocked fire exits were evident. The Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Command Centre were called and a Fire Safety Officer was requested to attend the premises. This incident led to Mr Keenan being served a Caution by the Fire Service on 9th January 2017. (*Pc Mark Dunn Statement - Attached to bundle Page 111-114*)

Correspondence received from Licensing Solutions on behalf of Helen Butler the Premises Licence Holder (*Attached to bundle Page 77-78*), shows a complete lack of control and responsibility on the part of Helen Butler.

I would remind the Sub-Committee that the guidance suggests that it is normally the responsibility of the Premises Licence Holder (*in this case Helen Butler*) as the holder of the Licence to ensure that the managers appointed to the premises are competent and appropriately trained in an effort to promote the four Licensing Objectives.

Competent

A person is not regarded as being "competent" unless he/she has sufficient training and experience or knowledge and other qualities to enable them to undertake the required preventative and protective measures.

To be clear the role of the designated premises supervisor is to be the sole individual specified in the operating schedule identified within the Premises Licence who is responsible for the day-to-day management of the business. This provides a single point of accountability for the Licensing Authority. The Licensing Act 2003 does not define the precise role of the designated premises supervisor, however, the guidance document for the local authority charges not only the day-to-day responsibility to the DPS, but also the responsibility of preventing disorder. Time and time again, Mr Keenan has shown a complete disregard for the licensing Act and for the relevant authorities, he has also demonstrated a lack of competence.

This was highlighted earlier this year when Mr Keenan was prosecuted for offences under section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003. Mr Keenan was given advice about "Wrestling" events being promoted and run at the premises. He and his management were advised that the premises licence did not allow for such events to take place. Mr Keenan insisted he knew best and held the events. Even after being reported for offences he continued to be defiant and continued disregarding advice given by the Licensing Authority and the Police.

Evidence for these offences and statements by attending officers can be found in the Licensing Authority submission.

I would respectfully remind the Sub Committee that Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 at 2.1 states; *"Licensing authorities should look to the police as the main source of advice on crime and disorder"*.

The Guidance states that each objective is of equal importance. There are no other statutory licensing objectives, so that the promotion of the four objectives is a paramount consideration at all times. However, at section 1.5 the Guidance explains *"that the legislation also supports a number of other key aims and purposes. These are vitally important and should be principal aims for everyone involved in licensing work."*


They include:

- *Protecting the public and local residents from crime, anti-social behaviour and noise nuisance caused by irresponsible licensed premises;*
- *Giving the police and licensing authorities the powers they need to effectively manage and police the night-time economy and take action against those premises that are causing problems;*
- *Recognising the important role which pubs and other licensed premises play in our local communities by minimising the regulatory burden on businesses, encouraging innovation and supporting responsible premises;*
- *Providing a regulatory framework for alcohol which reflects the needs of local communities and empowers local authorities to make and enforce decisions about the most appropriate licensing strategies for their local area; and*
- *Encouraging greater community involvement in licensing decisions and giving local residents the opportunity to have their say regarding licensing decisions that may affect them.*

The Guidance also states at 9.12; (Representations from police)

"In their role as a responsible authority, the police are an essential source of advice and information on the impact and potential impact of licensable activities, particularly on the crime and disorder objective. The police have a key role in managing the night-time economy and should have good working relationships with those operating in their local area. The police should be the licensing authority's main source of advice on matters relating to the promotion of the crime and disorder licensing objective, but may also be able to make relevant representations with regards to the other licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. The licensing authority should accept all reasonable and proportionate representations made by the police unless the authority has evidence that to do so would not be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. However, it

remains incumbent on the police to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing."

The Guidance also states at 11.18; (Powers of a licensing authority on the determination of a review)

"where responsible authorities like the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement - either orally or in writing - that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to address concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach and should take this into account when considering what further action is appropriate."

Therefore to clarify; the position of the Chief Officer of Police is one of requesting the **immediate revocation** of the premises licence for The Hairy Dog.

Placing additional restrictions by way of conditions at this time would only be futile and unsustainable due to the lack of confidence in the current management structure.

Solely removing the DPS would be unproductive as any person employed and working under the current management umbrella would undoubtedly be influenced by Mr Keenan and would not command any relevant control.

The Guidance states at 11.21;

"licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated premises supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual."

It goes on to state at 11.22;

"Equally, it may emerge that poor management is a direct reflection of poor company practice or policy and the mere removal of the designated premises supervisor may be an inadequate response to the problems presented. Indeed, where subsequent review hearings are generated by representations, it should be rare merely to remove a succession of designated premises supervisors as this would be a clear indication of deeper problems that impact upon the licensing objectives."

This decision is not one that was arrived at lightly and we are aware it affects people's livelihoods and their ability to earn a living. The interests of the Premise License Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) however, are secondary to the Licensing Objectives and the safety of the wider community.

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

On Thursday 14 June 2018 I was on duty and in full Police uniform when at approximately 1000hrs I attended The Hairy Dog, Becket Street, Derby, for a pre-arranged Licencing Compliance check with the manager of the premises Nick MAY and the Premises licence holder Paul KEENAN. Also present at the check was P.C. 2013 DUNN.

At the time of attendance the premises was not open for business. Both part A and B of the licence were kept on the Premises with part b displayed at the bar. On checking the licence there were several sections which were not being adhered to. These sections were contained within Annex 3 – conditions set by the licensing committee on 19/02/16 of licence PL10551179 which is the licence for the Hairy Dog.

Conditions that were not being met are as follows;

Door Supervisors daily record of attendance not countersigned by DPS. Contrary to section 11 Annex 3 Annex 3 S.11 "A daily record of the door supervisors that work at the premises (Whether paid or unpaid) will be retained at the premises and will include; Start time and finish time of each door supervisor, SIA Badge number, Door supervisors will sign and print their name in a legible form, each entry will be countersigned by the Designated Premises Supervisor"

No complaints log book, or evidence of checks being made for excessive noise. Contrary to Section 19 of Annex 3.

Annex 3 S.19 "The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events. A record of all complaints and any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a "complaints logbook" kept specifically for that purpose. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police

Officer, or any other authorised person as detailed within section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003, upon their request."

No agreement in writing from environmental health in respect to acceptable noise levels. Contrary to section 21 of Annex 3.

Annex 3 S.21 "Sound levels from amplified music shall be set at a level agreed in writing with the Environmental Protection Team, Environment and Regulatory Services, Derby City Council. The agreed level, which will be based on avoidance of noise nuisance to nearby sensitive receptors, shall not be exceeded at any time."

Staff training log not kept up to date. Contrary to section 25 and 26 of Annex 3.

Annex 3 S.25 "Refresher training will be given every 12 months"

Annex 3 S.26 "Records detailing the training provided will be written and retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003"

Since the log was started in 2016 there was no record of any re-training of staff already employed by the business and only one further entry recording training given to a new member of staff in 2018.

Although there is an incident log book in place it does not appear to be regularly maintained. The document runs from May 2017 to May 2018 with only 8 incidents documented within. As follows;

3. 19/02/18 - POLICE CALLED TO REMOVE MAMBA HEAD

5. 28/02/18 - KIRRA MARIE AND SAM KIRKMAN BARRED FOR FIGHTING
6. 12/03/18 - TRANS PERSON PULLED A KNIFE ON SOMEONE – POLICE CALLED
7. 05/04/18 - GUY TRIED TO PRESS ANOTHERS EYES IN, IN SOME KIND OF OUTBURST. KICKED OUT AND BARRED
8. 14/04/18 - GROUP REMOVED BY POOL TABLE FOR CREATING NUISANCE, BROKE OUT IN A FIGHT WHILE BEING EJECTED. DOORMAN KNOCKED OUT. POLICE ARRIVED AT SCENE.

Many incidents that had Police involvement have not been recorded these include but are not exclusive to;

Occurrence 18000193431. Incident 509-290418 29/04/18 Assault, victim is assaulted as they enter the premises by an unknown offender who is exiting.

Incident 50-08/04/18 Door supervisors request assistance as they struggle to eject a male from the premises.

Occurrence 18000110193 10/03/18 Unknown offender punches victim to face following an argument inside the Premises.

Incident 41-07/03/18. Group of five people getting out of hand following 2 being ejected by door staff. Caller was concerned as there was only one door supervisor on.

Occurrence 17000401230. Incident 19-180917 18/09/17 Assault. Report of a male causing problems with door supervisors at premises. Male is arrested for assault, threats to kill and possession of an offence weapon.

Occurrence 17000349804. Incident 63-160817. 16/08/17 Assault. Customer punches door supervisor to face whilst being ejected.

All the above incidents/occurrences have been included in the bundle.

It is worrying that these quite serious incidents all of which have been reported to the Police by either staff or members of the public have not been recorded as incidents in the log book. This re-enforces the point that little thought is being put into the conditions that were placed on the licence following the Variation Application Hearing in 2016. It appears that measures were put in place at the time to meet these conditions but are not being maintained, therefore raising concerns as to whether the licensing Objectives are being met. These being as follows.

- The prevention of crime and disorder

I have completed an infringement notice detailing the above points a copy of which was left with the Hairy Dog manager Nick MAY. This notice is included in the submitted bundle attached.

I have viewed a copy of a video that was uploaded to social media by a member of the public and produced and exhibited by P.C. 2024 WATTS as JGW/01 Master footage.

The footage shows altercation outside the hairy dog with Door Supervisors involved. Numbers represent the length of the clip not actual time of incident.

Door Supervisors are wearing high vis jackets on which the strips shine in the street light

00:25 Melee of people directly outside the curtilage of the Hairy Dog members of the public involved with punches being thrown at people on the floor.

00:42 Group splits with male in chequered shirt and pony tail and bald male in jeans and braces in the entranceway to the Hairy Dog with the Door Supervisors and other males in the street facing them in a "standoff" position

00:50 Male in braces, a member of the Door Supervisors and a third male enter the road in an aggressive manner towards the other males

00:56 Large Door Supervisor swings a punch at the head of member of the public who is fighting back with him.

01:07 Bald Door Supervisor steps off the curb and kicks unknown male on floor.

01:14 Male in chequered shirt and pony tail swings a punch at unknown male who is on the floor before once again returning to the entrance to the Hairy Dog

01:20 3 males left prostrate on the floor

On Wednesday 13th June 2018 I viewed a copy of CCTV taken from the Halry Dog. This had been composed from five CCTV cameras covering the Premises, exhibit FP/1. This copy was edited to give a flow of events which had occurred on the 15th April 2018. There are some overlaps in times where a number of cameras cover different aspects of the Premises.

These are the pertinent points I have viewed

I have put the running times of this disc, starting from 00:00, as the main source of reference. I have put the actual times in brackets as they are not too clear on the screen.

Camera 7: Bar/Pool table area

00:08 (01:57:25) onwards: A member of the door staff comes from behind the bar and starts speaking with a male who is in a group by the pool table. The door staff (in a dark jacket with florescent markers on the arm) is indicating for the group of four males to leave. One of the group, offers some resistance.

Camera change: Camera 4 Bar area

01:37 (01:58:44) Group appear from the left. A male with a bald head and light shirt is being pushed out by another member of the group and the single door staff continued ushering the group out.

Camera change: Camera 3 Internal entrance

My role is currently the Licensing Sergeant and I have been in post since 17th April 2018.

I have been a police officer for 17 years and have been in the rank of Sergeant for 12 years.

At approximately 1420 hours on Wednesday 13th June 2018 I was on duty in full police uniform at St Marys Wharf Police Station, Derby.

At this time I attended Licensed premises called THE HAIRY DOG which is situated on BECKET STREET, DERBY.

I was present with Pc 2013 Mark Dunn, Licensing Officer for Derbyshire Constabulary, and we asked for the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS); named on the Licence as Paul KEENAN. We were advised that we had 'just missed him' and that perhaps we should call back.

This was advised by a male who was behind the bar, when asked he stated that his name was NICK. NICK advised that he was the Bar Manager and offered no further details.

We advised NICK that the purpose of our visit was to complete a Licensing check and therefore we spoke with NICK to commence part of this process, and as much as was possible with NICK, he had identified himself as being the most senior member of staff present.

Whilst at the premises I viewed the Incident book, the book which is required by all premises to keep and evidence all incidents at the premises. I noted that there were no incidents recorded in this book since 31st May 2018. (A copy of this book is attached to this bundle.)

As noted above the date was mid June and therefore this surprised me. When asked regarding this NICK advised that it should be completed daily however he had been off and that it had clearly not been done. He would complete this... I question how this can be done after the fact by another not present at the time.

Entries should be made to this book daily as part of the Licence, even if no incidents occur.

I further looked at the refusals book. A copy of this is attached to this statement.

Also attached to this statement is a copy of the training log, Training Manual signatures and the Fire Safety training certificate of Nicholas May – dated 28/8/15.

Whilst present at the premises, which I had not attended previously, I looked around and whilst doing so was concerned as to the general hygiene at the location. Within the ladies toilets there is a significant amount of what appears to unauthorised graffiti scrawled around the walls, doors, and cubicles. This was clearly not 'art'. This gives the toilets a general sense of uncleanliness.

I went into the gents toilets and there was what appeared, and smelt, to be vomit in the urinal. There was only three patrons present at any one time during the duration of our visit, which was approximately 30 minutes. I advised Nick of this, and he stated that he would clean it immediately after we had left.

My final point to note within this statement is my shock and dismay at the language which was on public display at numerous locations within the premises.

As I walked into The Hairy Dog I saw immediately that projected on to the back screen there was an image of Mickey Mouse, a childrens character and an icon, which I would estimate to be approximately 3ft tall, and above this image there was the words "DON'T BE A CUNT", written as I have in capital letters.

As an experienced police officer I understand that I should not be shocked at certain words and behaviour and there should be an acceptance of some bad, foul, and abusive language. However, this word is defined in the Dictionary as vulgar and which I whole heartedly agree with.

Whilst speaking with Nick at the bar area I further noted the same words again, this time written above Tigger and Winnie the Pooh; once again children characters. This was being displayed on a large TV screen above the bar.

I appreciate that these are there that somebody has the opinion that these are funny, however, I believe people walking into the premises may easily be alarmed at what I saw on display.

I consider that there is no need for the use of these words, especially when associated with childrens characters.

I seriously considered dealing with this matter under Section 5 of the Public Order Act 1986 which is an offence for someone to display writing or signs likely to cause a reasonable person harassment, alarm or distress.

In light of the ongoing proceedings, I have not taken this matter further at this stage, and I intend to deal with this by other means.

Morning Mark,

Just catching up with this after being away for a few days. Apart from the recent incident the only other one we have logged for the Hairy Dog was this from the 25 Nov 2017.

3.25am - Came across police officers dealing with the aftermath of an assault outside Hairy Dog, the perpetrator was in the police van and we cleaned up the blood from the face of the young man who was the victim. He was not interested in going to hospital and there was not much else we could do so left him in the care of the police.

As for the incident on 14/15 April this was the report that I wrote up:

At 2-30am we were on the Wardwick when we noticed a big fight starting outside the Hairy Dog. There were at least 7 or 8 fighting including 4 skinheads. I immediately called CCTV and for the police, but as at least two of the men were on the ground getting a severe kicking, and no police were there, I personally intervened to try and distract them as my initial thought was the serious injuries that could have been inflicted. In hindsight it was not the wisest thing to do as I was putting myself in danger and also compromising the safety of the rest of the team. When the police arrived, there were three men on the ground and we quickly had to assess how to deal with them. Helene went to one who was conscious and a minor head wound, Shirley and David to one who was semi-conscious, and myself to another who was conscious and no external injuries. He quickly got up and was handled by the police. After checking with the others on the condition of their casualty I called an ambulance. Fortunately, because I was in a call queue when I did get through I was told that someone had already registered the incident. The paramedics had a quick look at Helene's casualty and chose not to do anything as he was stood up and only had a small wound to his forehead. The other casualty was taken into the ambulance for assessment. The overall outcome was that no one was arrested as it was not clear what had provoked the fight and no one was willing to make any accusations against anyone else.

Briefing Paper: Cardiff Data – The Hairy Dog or Becket Street

June 2018

1 Summary

In Derby there were 137 recorded alcohol-related incidents between May 2017 and May 2018. This paper provides a high-level summary of the incidents with a location captured as either The Hairy Dog or Becket Street. There were 4 such incidents recorded between May 2017 and May 2018. This is likely to highlight a data recording issue, which will be addressed through engagement with the emergency department.

1.1 The Hairy Dog/Becket Street

The Hairy Dog & Paul Keenan 08/12/66

The Security Industry Authority is the organisation responsible for regulating the private security industry. They are an independent body under the terms of the Private Security Industry Act 2001. Their remit covers the United Kingdom. They have two main duties. One is the compulsory licensing of individuals undertaking designated activities within the private security industry; the other is to manage the voluntary Approved Contractor Scheme, which measures private security suppliers against independently assessed criteria.

SIA licensing covers manned guarding (including security guarding, door supervision, close protection, cash and valuables in transit, and public space surveillance using CCTV), key holding and vehicle immobilising. Licensing ensures that private security operatives are 'fit and proper' persons who are properly trained and qualified to do their job. The Private Security Industry Act 2001 requires those engaging in licensable activity be licensed to do so by the SIA and individuals who deploy them to for fill a contract complete the relevant due diligence to ensure they are deploying licensed operatives. They do this by using the online public licence checker and keeping up to date details of all those working for them.

My role as an investigations officer is to investigate non-compliance with the Private Security Industry Act 2001 from the security industry.

I attended the Hairy Dog venue in Derby on 24th March 2018, there I spoke to two individuals who identified themselves as doorman. Ezekiel Gayle 12/6/66 and Kevin Brand 11/05/68. Both individuals could not tell me if they were self-employed or worked for the bar itself. They also could not provide me with their unique tax reference number. I have submitted a request for HMRC to review their employment status and tax identification. According to the online Employment checker on the HMRC website, both men are employed by the venue. As they are verbally contracted, and directed to carry out their duties on a rota basis by the venue. This means that the person deploying them is also not complying with HMRC legislation.

In accordance with the Section 3 PSIA 2001 this would mean that Paul Keenan would need a valid SIA Licence in order to manage and deploy the two door staff.

Hi Kelvin,

Sorry it has taken a while to respond to your email from the 12th November.

As regards the meeting you have asked for I need to make some points about it before it is arranged. We have already had one meeting that was not productive and so I feel it is important that both parties are absolutely clear on what we are trying to achieve and we can avoid wasting people's time as we did on the last occasion. So to that end (as speaking to Helen seems to be your motivation for the meeting) I want to outline now what Helen Butler can bring to a meeting and then I will outline what I want the meeting to achieve on behalf of my client.

As you are aware Helen Butler is the sole Director of HKB Enterprises the Premises Licence Holders. However, Helen does not have any active role or part in the running of this business. As you are already aware the business is run and managed entirely by Paul Keenan and he is the person responsible for conducting the licensable activities. The structure of the operations and all management decisions are made by him. You state that you are 'duty bound' to speak with her but that is legally incorrect and I am not sure where you get this from. The case of Hall V Woodhouse made clear the role of the Premises Licence Holder and it is not a requirement for them to have knowledge of activities/management at a premises. I want to be absolutely clear that Helen will NOT be able to tell you anything about the day to day running of the business. She can sit and listen to your concerns about Paul Keenan but it is Paul Keenan himself that needs to hear about your concerns and not Helen. So while we are prepared to facilitate this meeting out of cooperation there will in fact be very little that Helen Butler can contribute.

I also want to be clear that we would only attend a meeting with the intention of resolving any issues you have and with the express intention of coming to an agreed position on the application. We did that on the last occasion and did what was asked of us by preparing a Dispersal Policy for it to have no effect. **If you are intending to object to this application regardless of this meeting then I would ask that you declare this as I do not want to attend a meeting can achieve nothing.**

If you feel there is scope for this application to be agreed then I will arrange for both Helen and Paul to be present so you can have all your questions answered about the running and management of this business. Likewise, if you are to make negative comments about how the premises is run then I will need to know the specific reasons why that is so with the evidence to corroborate it. If you are to make reference to logs linked to the premises (as you did refer to 28 incidents previously) then I will need to see the full logs of the incidents. I do not want the same situation to arise as in the last meeting where we attended and then you refused to give us any detail about your apparent concerns.

Please can you consider what I have said and get back to me?

I look forward to hearing from you.

The Hairy Dog Dispersal Policy

Introduction

This policy sets out the steps the venue will take at the end of the trading session to minimise the potential for issues as customers leave the premises. The policy will be kept under constant review to address any issues should they arise.

The policy is based on a number of relevant factors but the primary factors include the long term experience of what happens at the venue every week when people disperse at the end of the evening, the type of customers that frequent the venue and how this is managed at present.

The Venue

The venue is a live music venue that is very prominent and respected in the UK for the quality of the bands and events it holds. Approximately 20 bands play a week and the bands that play there are touring bands from all over the world and the UK. They play all day and into the evening.

The audience for these bands are made up of 2 distinct groups. There are travelling fans from all over the UK who come to the venue from far and wide by coach and train. The remainder are local people. This has considerable relevance to the way that the people disperse at the end of the evening as it means they leave at different times. Travelling fans have a journey to make at the end of the evening and tend to leave as soon as the band finishes. Some travelling fans stay locally in hotels.

With the exception of local events (which take place on rare occasions) the events are online ticket sales and approximately 80 % of all tickets are pre-sold this way. That means the operators know how many people are coming to the venue for a particular band and are able to plan in advance accordingly.

The procedure outlined below is based on the well-established gradual pattern of dispersal from the premises which works well.

Timings

The venue already benefits from a terminal hour for alcohol sales at 3am and closure of the premises at 3.30am. The music ending at 12 midnight and the 3 to 3.30am terminal hour are key to the natural & gradual dispersal of the customers over a 3 hour period.

Function room

Live music to finish at 0000

Last orders at the bar 0145

Bar closes & recorded music to finish at 0200

Room closes 0200

Main Public Bar

Last orders at the bar 0245

Bar closes & recorded music to finish at 0300

Venue closes 0330

Music & Lighting

Music volume will be reduced at 0245

At 0300 - All cleaning lights go on at 0300 (transforms the venue from dark to almost daylight).

Music turned off

Doorstaff patrol the premises asking customers to drink up and leave the premises quietly 0300

Cloakroom

The cloakroom will be set up in order to assist the swift return of coats.

Minimising Noise on Exit

SIA Doorstaff will oversee the end of night departure period. They will be on the street as another set of eyes and ears identifying potential problems. They will encourage customers to vacate the area outside the premises and not to congregate outside the venue.

SIA Doorstaff will direct customers to the nearest taxi ranks or other transportation away from the area.

Transport

There is a taxi rank directly outside the venue.

Where the gig is likely to be popular, all taxi companies will be informed of the date and times of the gig so that adequate taxis are provided.

I am the Licensing Sergeant for the 'D' Division of the Derbyshire Constabulary and I am currently stationed in the Licensing Section at St Mary's Wharf, Prime Parkway, Derby.

I am currently responsible for licensing enforcement matters on behalf of the Derbyshire Constabulary for those premises, within 'D' Division, licensed under The Licensing Act 2003.

I hold the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders, the BIIAB National Certificate for Designated Premises Supervisors, the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Licensing Practitioners, the BIIAB National Certificate for Licensees in Drugs Awareness and the BIIAB Level 1 Award in Responsible Alcohol Retailing.

At about 03:30 in the early hours of Monday morning, an incident occurred inside the premises involving an altercation between two male individuals, both of which were under the influence of alcohol, having consumed a quantity through out the evening within the premises.

The altercation was escalating and as a result one male was ejected from the premise by a member of staff. The ejected male was abusive and aggressive and eventually caused criminal damage to the premise by way of breaking a glass window to the front of the building.

The male was again restrained by a number of people from the premise, this eventually resulted in the male being assaulted by the individual who he had earlier engaged in an altercation inside the premise.

Due to this incident I had cause to view the available recorded CCTV footage from 03:00am until 03:40; the Premises Licence allows activities until 03:00.

I could clearly see that people were still in the bar drinking after 03:00, the bar staff were closing the bar and removing all the nozzles from the pumps.

At 03:10 I saw Mr KEENAN talking to the female bar staff that after instruction put a nozzle back onto a pump and pour a pint. She passed the pint to a large male who was standing with KEENAN at the bar; no money was seen to be exchanged at this time.

A little later the same bar staff was seen to serve a male and female standing at the bar with drinks from optics above the bar, on this occasion a monetary transaction did take place, the female at the bar was seen handing over money which was placed in the till and change was given.

Further to this a male who was sat on a stool at the bar spoke to the bar staff and she served him a pint and a spirit chaser, again I could see on the footage that money had changed hands and the customer had purchased alcohol after the time allowed by the licence.

I also noticed a female slumped over to the left side of the bar this female looked asleep but seemed to be intoxicated.

The licence allowed the premise to remain open until 03:30; people were clearly seen within the premise drinking alcohol after this time.

It was evident from this short half an hour insight in to the operating practices at the premise, that the licensing objectives were not being adhered to and that offences were blatantly being carried out, serving after time authorised and possibly serving to people that are drunk to name just two.

One male who was visibly frightened was seen to be chased through the premise by another male, he took refuge behind the bar, and no staff attempted to intervene or seemed remotely concerned about what was occurring.

Mr KEENAN was also seen on two occasions assisting people from the premise that were obviously drunk and causing issues. I would say that the way these people were dealt with was over handed and could have been dealt with more appropriately. Other people from the bar that were not obviously SIA trained helped Mr KEENAN when ejecting these people.

It is concerning at the lack of control witnessed in such a short space of time, it will be argued by Mr KEENAN that the police are very rarely called to the premise because of trouble. I would suggest that the reason for this is that all incidents are dealt with in house and are seldom reported to the police, there where certainly no records of any incidents listed in any logs with in the premises; I find this to be most un realistic given what I have witnessed on the CCTV recording.

The reputation gained by these premises seems to attract revellers who may have already been drinking alcohol excessively and are quite often in a drunken state within the premise; these customers are allowed in most instances to continue drinking alcohol without challenge by management or staff.

Supplying more alcohol to such people is highly irresponsible and the consequences can be

at times severe; resulting in disorderly behaviour and innocent people getting injured or at the very least fearing for their safety.

The information already mentioned is evidence in itself that the management particularly Mr KEENAN have not heeded any advice given to them by the responsible Authorities, including the police; they continued to show very little control of the people frequenting their premises and have failed to prevent people getting into drunken states, this has then caused serious issues for the police, the general public and staff they employ. The management have not or simply can not promote the licensing objectives; even when under the spotlight having been given relevant helpful advice.

On Thursday 19th April 2012 along with PC 2013 DUNN had a meeting with Mr KEENAN at his request.

Mr KEENAN wanted clarification on what had been discussed with his employers about his suitability to become a DPS at another premises. It was explained that it was a matter for his employer to discuss his contract with him not the responsibility of the police.

It was pointed out however that at the present time we felt that we would not be able to support any application of Mr KEENAN having a responsible position of DPS. It was stressed that we had no confidence in him to operate and manage a licensed premises in a manner in which to promote the licensing objectives.

Having heard our explanation as to why we did not think him a suitable person to hold the position of DPS Mr KEENAN accepted that mistakes were made but blamed the owners of the freehold for not financing the premises adequately. It was explained that the state of the premises was a mess and that even the basics had not been done in respect to promoting the licensing objectives. He had produced no paper work or any evidence what so ever to give any indication that he was a responsible operator even after being asked to do so.

Mr KEENAN did not admit to any failings on his part, stating he had run pubs for 16 years without incident. Even after telling him our concerns he was adamant he was not to blame for any licensing breaches sighting other people instead.

Mr KEENAN never mentioned at this time his involvement in any other premises, we asked him to talk to us at a later date should he get involved in any future ventures with in Derby. It was of great surprise to me when I was made aware in Mr KEENANS involvement in the Hairy Dog on Becket Street. Until the DPS variation the police where in the dark as to Mr

KENNAN's involvement, we had obviously heard rumours but had not been approached for consultation.

It has since transpired that Mr KENNAN has indeed opened a bar on Becket Street, with the intention of opening the upstairs area as a live music venue. Although I am not against such venues, I am concerned that Mr KENNAN has completely ignored the responsible authorities and the Licensing Act; he has recklessly forged forward opening a venue for licensable activities with out the correct authorisations in place.

The role of the designated premises supervisor as outlined in the "Guidance" is to be the sole individual specified in the operating schedule identified within the Premises Licence who is responsible for the day-to-day management of the business. This provides a single point of accountability for the Licensing Authority. The Licensing Act 2003 does not define the precise role of the designated premises supervisor, however, the guidance document for the local authority charges not only the day-to-day responsibility to the DPS, but also the responsibility of preventing disorder. Time and time again, Mr KEENAN has shown a complete disregard for the licensing Act and for the relevant authorities.

There are clearly serious failings on the part of Mr KEENAN as a DPS and manager to prevent the offending behaviour complained of. These failings in some cases are so profound and the offending behaviour is so serious that the police have no confidence in Mr KEENAN to hold a Premise Licence or indeed be a DPS.

It is also the view of the Police that the evidence presented to the Licensing Sub-Committee demonstrates that, ultimately, an exceptional low standard of management has led to a succession of poor practices being allowed to develop at the premises Mr KEENAN has previously been allowed to control.

It is my view that Paul Douglas KEENAN should not be allowed to be a Designated Premise Supervisor and the application for him to be so should be refused.

GENERAL LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE

NOTE OF DECISION

NAME: THE HAIRY DOG (FORMERLY KNOWN AS BECKETS BAR)

ADDRESS: 1-7 BECKET STREET, DERBY, DE1 1HT

1. The Sub-Committee has considered an application for a variation of a premises licence to specify an individual as Designated Premises Supervisor at The Hairy Dog, 1-7 Becket Street, Derby, DE1 1HT.
2. The Sub-Committee has heard evidence from Sandra Mansell (Licensing) PC Mark Dunn (Derbyshire Constabulary) Sergeant Lomas (Derbyshire Constabulary) David Bowen (Derbyshire Fire and Rescue) Mr Paul Keenan (Applicant) and has taken into account the objection notice received and the written documentation received.
3. The Applicant, Mr Keenan, initially made an application to adjourn this hearing. Mr Keenan submitted that he had received the bundle of evidence from Derbyshire Constabulary on 29th June at 17.30 hours which gave him insufficient time for consideration and to bring any witnesses. The sub-committee considered this application having heard representations from Derbyshire Constabulary and the Licensing authority. The sub-committee dealt with this application as a preliminary issue. The sub-committee were satisfied that Mr Keenan had sufficient notice of this hearing, he was informed on 19th April 2012 that if he were to make an application to be specified as a DPS, Derbyshire Constabulary would object due to his management of a previous premises. The bundle of evidence submitted by Derbyshire Constabulary consisted of information and records of conversations with Mr Keenan himself, there was no new information whereby Mr Keenan would be prejudiced if the hearing proceeded. The application to adjourn was therefore refused.

Findings of Fact

4. Sub-Committee made the following findings of fact:
 - (a) That the individual to be specified, Paul Douglas Keenan, is a personal licence holder and has been for approximately 14 years and was previously a Designated Premises Supervisor at the Old Bell, Sadler Gate, Derby and held that position for approximately 3 ½ years.
 - (b) That there was an objection from Derbyshire Constabulary, a responsible authority, in accordance with section 37(5) of the Licensing Act 2003, that the application will undermine the crime and disorder objective.
 - (c) The sub-committee were satisfied that there had previously been mismanagement by Mr Keenan whilst he was a Designated Premises Supervisor at the Old Bell. There had been significant alterations to the

- Old Bell for example, lighting and sound systems being installed. This was a Grade 2 listed building, of which Mr Keenan had not consulted with or sought the consent of the local authority prior to these alterations being carried out. The premises had a poor level of hygiene. Mr Keenan sought to place the blame for this on the owner of the building. However, as Designated Premises Supervisor, Mr Keenan, these were matters which were within his control. The sub-committee were also concerned as to the nature of alcohol fuelled violent incidents which had been reported to Derbyshire Constabulary and which occurred at the Old Bell during the time Mr Keenan held the position of Designated Premises Supervisor. Mr Keenan was not able to provide any proof of an incident log, which he claims has been lost by Derbyshire Constabulary.
- (d) The sub-committee were also informed by Derbyshire Fire and Rescue that Mr Keenan had not complied with an action plan which was in force during the time that he was Designated Premises Supervisor at the Old Bell.
 - (e) The Old Bell was subject to an expedited review and also a full review whereby the premises licence was suspended together with a significant number of conditions being placed on the licence. This was due to the serious concerns regarding crime and disorder which had been taking place at the premises.
 - (f) Mr Keenan has been in control of the Hairy Dog which has been operating for approximately 5 weeks. During that time it has become apparent that alterations have been made to the premises without the proper authorisation. It is only when Derbyshire Constabulary has pointed out to Mr Keenan that he was conducting unauthorised licensable activities has he now applied for a minor variation retrospectively.
 - (g) During visits conducted by Derbyshire Constabulary to the Hairy Dog, Mr Keenan could only produce part of the summary premises licence, was not fully aware of the conditions on the licence nor could he produce any due diligence paperwork.
 - (h) Mr Keenan was given a closure notice at 22.05 hours on Saturday 30th June by Derbyshire Constabulary due to unauthorised licensable activities taking place at the Hairy Dog. However, Derbyshire Constabulary confirmed that the premises was not closed by Mr Keenan as an Inspector was able to enter the premises some time after the notice was served.
 - (i) The sub-committee find that Mr Keenan has shown contempt for the licensing regime by failing to seek the proper approval for alterations to second premises that he seeks to manage. This could potentially put safety at risk should the alterations not conform to a safe and agreed standard with the responsible authorities.

Decision

4. In making its decision, the Sub-Committee has had regard to the Derby City Council Licensing Policy, the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Human Rights Act 1998 and has carefully considered all the evidence presented to it.

5. The Sub-Committee has **RESOLVED** to **REFUSE** the application for a variation of a premises licence to specify an individual as Designated Premises Supervisor at The Hairy Dog, 1-7 Becket Street, Derby, DE1 1HT.
6. The reasons for this decision are as follows:
 - 6.1 Having taken into account the Licensing Act 2003 and in particular the crime prevention objective, the amended guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's licensing policy and the Human Rights Act, the Sub-Committee sought to balance the interests of the applicant and the representations made by the Derbyshire Constabulary.
 - 6.2 The amended guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 allows for a police objection where in exceptional circumstances, they believe that the appointment would undermine the crime prevention objective.
 - 6.3 Having considered all of the evidence and considered the representations made to it, the Sub-Committee found that there were exceptional circumstances which justified the refusal of this application namely; the poor management of the Old Bell and latterly the Hairy Dog, the blatant disregard for the Licensing regime by Mr Keenan and an unwillingness to engage or adhere to any advice given by Responsible Authorities.
 - 6.4 The sub-committee found that the refusal of the application was appropriate in order to promote the licensing objective of crime and disorder.
7. All Parties may appeal this decision. Guidance on this process is attached to the decision notice.

GUIDANCE NOTES ON APPEALING AGAINST THE COUNCIL'S DECISION

Please read these notes carefully

If you wish to appeal against this decision Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003 governs how you should make your appeal to the Magistrates Court.

The appeal must be commenced by **Notice of Appeal to the Justices' Chief Executive for the Southern Derbyshire Magistrates Court** at the address below. You should contact the Magistrates Court or your Solicitor immediately to obtain the correct documentation to ensure that your appeal is made correctly.

Unless you are exempt, the Magistrates Court will require you to pay a fee when you lodge your appeal. You should contact the Magistrates Court or your Solicitor immediately to find out how much you will have to pay.

You must lodge your appeal with the Court within the period of 21 days beginning with the day on which you were notified of the decision. This means that the signed Notice of Appeal and court fee [if applicable] must reach the Court within 21 days. The Court cannot accept appeals lodged once this appeal period has expired.

On appeal, the Magistrates' Court may-

- (a) dismiss the appeal;
- (b) substitute for the decision appealed against any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority;
- (c) remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the discretion of the Court;
- (d) make such order for costs as it thinks fit.

You are strongly advised to take this decision notice to the Magistrates Court or your Solicitor when seeking advice on how to appeal.

Paul, I have personally spoken to you on more than one occasion, both at your premises and at St Marys Wharf police station. You have been advised numerous times over the years about your responsibilities as the Premise Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor of the bar known as the Hairy Dog and before that The Bell Hotel.

I would remind you that it is normally the responsibility of the Premises Licence Holder as the holder of the licence to ensure that any Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) appointed to the premises are competent and appropriately trained in an effort to promote the four Licensing Objectives; in this case you have double the responsibility.

I am aware that a variation was received by this department on 16th February 2015 requesting to transfer the premise licence from H.I.P Promotions Ltd to H/K/B Enterprises Ltd; this I believe is due to the former company going into liquidation. As you are the person in day to day charge of The Hairy Dog, I require clarification regarding who is ultimately in control of the Premises Licence and who owns the building.

On 16th March a Temporary Event Notice was received for an event to take place in an unlicensed extended part of your premises. The event being advertised to take place on Easter Sunday was immediately objected to by the police for fears of crime and disorder and public safety issues.

On 24th March 2015 I attended your premises and spoke to you in person, I explained my concerns about the event scheduled for Easter Sunday and the apparent lack of any risk assessment to control numbers and evacuation in case of an emergency. You assured me at this time that the building had been passed as safe by a "Fire Safety Officer" and was acceptable for this event up to and exceeding 550 people.

During this visit I made it very clear to you that the extended area at the rear of the premises was not licensed and could not be used for licensable activities. You assured me at this time that it had never been used for licensable activities and an application for a premises licence would be submitted before any such events take place.

I noticed there was a working bar in this new extended area and a fully functional stage, with rigging for lights and speakers. On closer examination of the bar it was obvious to me that it had been used in some capacity recently, this would confirm to me, that information that I have been passed is true, suggesting gigs with bands have played in the venue.

After our meeting, later on the same day, I received a phone call from Derbyshire Fire and Rescue service, confirming to me that the building in its present state was in fact not safe and that a prohibition notice had been served by a Fire Safety Officer preventing any public assembly.

With this new information, I immediately spoke to Mr Angus Carrington the applicant for the Temporary Event Notice; I explained my concerns about the safety of the premises and requested that he considered withdrawing the Temporary Event Notice. Mr Carrington told me that he was under the impression from you that the work required to lift the prohibition notice was minimal and would be completed in time for the event and he would therefore take you at your word and appeal the police objection at a panel hearing.

Of greater concern, is that after conducting further enquiries I have evidence to suggest that on the 17th March 2015 an unlicensed event took place at your premises. Over 600 people attended and watched "The Sleaford Mods" a well-known band from Nottingham. The sale of alcohol by retail and regulated entertainment took place in the venue and you completely disregarded all of the advice previously given. Not only were you committing offences under The licensing Act 2003 you were also complicit in putting all of those people attending the gig in danger should an emergency have occurred.

I also note on various web sites on the internet that you have a full event schedule of gigs booked, some it seems are planned for the extended back room. It is inconceivable that all of these bands will be playing upstairs on the first floor of your premises. As you are fully aware the total capacity for that room is only 60 persons and some of the bands listed have a large followings far in excess of 50 people.

I have tried to reason with you, I have supported you on your application to become the DPS at the premises and I have always given you sound advice. Unfortunately I have lost any confidence in your ability to promote the four licensing objectives and have any day to day control of the venue. The patience of the Police Licensing Department has reached its limits and although I have taken a proportionate and a balanced approach into consideration, I have no other course of action now but to advise you in no uncertain terms that I will be considering applying to Derby City Council Licensing Authority for a review of the Premise Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.

I can tell you that at the review stage an application would be made by the Police to revoke the licence completely as no additional conditions could be imposed to give police confidence that the licensing objectives would be promoted.

These measures may seem extreme but I now feel that I would be neglecting my duty as a licensing enforcement officer for Derbyshire Constabulary if I did not bring my concerns and the evidence there based on before the Local Authority Licensing Sub-Committee to make an informed and unbiased decision about the future of this Premise Licence.

I believe that the police have given yourself and other management of The Hairy Dog sufficient advice and support over the past few years for these issues to have been resolved. I feel that we are at a stage when positive action needs to be taken against the Premise Licence.

In my role I have a duty of care to people living, working, and enjoying them selves in Derby City centre to protect them where possible from being subjected to alcohol related violence and the fear of violence emanating from our night time economy, I also have an obligation to protect them where possible from inscrutable operators who are intent on putting profit before public safety. This can only be achieved with the full support of the Premises Licence Holders and Designated Premises Supervisors in the City, working in partnership with the Responsible Authorities to fully promote all four licensing objectives.

I would advise that you contact me to arrange a meeting to discuss a way forward; it may be advantageous to you at this time to seek legal advice preferably with a solicitor that deals with Licensing Law.

If you have any comments to make or wish to discuss the matter further then by all means contact me on the numbers listed.

A copy of this letter will be forwarded to the Licensing Team at Derby City Council and Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service for their information and file.

Description As part of the Night Time Economy patrol strategy I attended the premises to liaise with the DPS Paul KEENAN (ex DPS, Old Bell). I spoke with him with regards to the licensable activities that were on the premises licence and ensured that he knew what conditions were on his licence. He stated that officers from our department had visited several times and had been through the premises licence with him as part of a licensing inspection. I questioned Paul what his plans were for the first floor to which he stated that he had built a stage and moved the bar slightly, when asked if he had submitted a minor variation for these alteration he began to meke reference to the fact that it was just 're siting' what was already in situ. I reinforced my comments by explaining the differences between a minor and full variation and qualified this comment by stating that prior to opening the first floor an application for a minor variation was required, this should really have been completed and submitted prior to the works starting.

He understood this and stated that he would sort it.

The premises were not very busy with a regular crowd from the old bell hotel and the same doorstaff. These are still believed to be self employed. Documentation confirming this fact was not able to be seen at the time of the inspection.

Paul also stated that he was only going to be temporary DPS pending the objection to him being full time DPS by the Police. He made reference to being a DPS for over 14 years and commented that he required to speak with the Licensing SGT. Message left on voice mail.

Description At the above date and time I visited the premises as part of the NTE checks being conducted within the city. At the time of my visit I spoke to PAUL KEENAN in order to establish his role at the premises. I requested to see the full licence part A which Keenan could not produce. He stated that it was with the council who were in the process of issuing a new licence. He did produce the summary part B which was the old licence with limited information and the details of the old DPS. At the time of my visit Keenan could not produce any documentary evidence to show that he was promoting the licensing objectives or complying with legal requirements. A full inspection was not carried out due to time constraints. I stated to Keenan that I would return Sat 26/05 and that I wanted to see all of his policies, evidence to show due diligence etc. I noted at the time of the visit that minor alterations were being carried out on the first floor of the premises. A small stage had been built at the far end of the room along with what Keenan described as a sound engineers booth on the back of the stairwell wall. The original bar had been revamped/renewed and an internal wall had been removed to open the room up.

I returned on Sat 26/05 at 22:00 and Keenan produced what I can only describe as hastily prepared documents in relation to fire risk assessments, age verification, noise, incident, and refusals logs fire safety equipment checks etc. Keenan stated that he had made an appointment to meet with Mr Parks of DFRS wed.30/05 and that he would chase up his premises licence 28/05....

13/1/2018 - 21:38 Hairy Dog asked if police go to the venue (not urgent states Kev) just to have a word with a customer who's been a pain, I explain when police come available in the city centre I'll ask them to nip to the venue.

14/1/2018 - 01:38 Hairy dog asked to monitor the venue due to two males being aggressive towards door staff.

11/2/2018 - 00:54 Hairy dog asked if I had any police in area of the venue, I explained that he had two officers walking towards the venue.

11/2/2018 - 01:07 Hairy dog asked if I had any police in area of the venue, police informed and went to the venue.

17/2/2018 - 03:08 Hairy dog asked for police due to group of people fighting in the street police informed by TM1.

23/2/2018 - 22:41 Hairy Dog passed on the male from above who had returned and started being aggressive once refused entry again.

24/2/2018 - 01:43 Police passed on IC4 male who had been aggressive to door staff at Hairy Dog when they refused him

18/3/2018 - 02:40 Monitored a fight near Hairy Dog. Police intervened and arrested IC1 male.

8/4/2018 - 01:08 Hairy dog asked for police to move a male away from the venue to being aggressive to door staff. Police informed.

14/4/2018 - 01:44 Hairy dog explained two were fighting near the venue, door staff from Living lounge broke it up.

Street Pastor Report - At 2.30 we were on the Wardwick when we noticed a big fight starting outside the Hairy Dog. There were at least 7 or 8 fighting including 4 skinheads. I immediately called CCTV and for the police, but as at least two of the men were on the ground getting a severe kicking, and no police were there, I personally intervened to try and distract them as my initial thought was the serious injuries that could have been inflicted. In hindsight it was not the wisest thing to do as I was putting myself in danger and also compromising the safety of the rest of the team. When the police arrived, there were three men on the ground and we quickly had to assess how to deal with them. Helene went to one who was conscious and a minor head wound, Shirley and David to one who was semi-conscious, and myself to another who was conscious and no external injuries. He quickly got up and was handled by the police. After checking with the others on the condition of their casualty I called an ambulance. Fortunately, because I was in a call queue when I did get through I was told that someone had already registered the incident. The paramedics had a quick look at Helene's casualty and chose not to do anything as he was stood up and only had a small wound to his forehead. The other casualty was taken into the ambulance for assessment. The overall outcome was that no one was arrested as it was not clear what had provoked the fight and no one was willing to make any accusations against anyone else.

I am a Licensing Enforcement Officer for the 'D' Division of the Derbyshire Constabulary and I am currently stationed in the Licensing Section at St Mary's Wharf, Prime Parkway, Derby.

I am currently responsible for licensing enforcement matters on behalf of the Derbyshire Constabulary for those premises, within 'D' Division, licensed under The Licensing Act 2003.

I hold the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders, the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Designated Premises Supervisors, the BIIAB Level 2 National Certificate for Licensing Practitioners, the BIIAB National Certificate for Licensees in Drugs Awareness and the BIIAB Level 1 Award in Responsible Alcohol Retailing.

At 00:05 on Saturday 1st October 2016 I had cause to attend "The Hairy Dog" which is situated on Becket Street in Derby. I had been passed information from a member of public that a lot of people were at the venue due to a Drum and Bass event, the event with several different Dee-Jays performing. I was concerned as the police and other responsible authorities had not been made aware of the event and it could have quite probably posed serious Crime and Disorder issues that had not been resourced.

On arrival I spoke to Mick Gayle the head door staff, I asked to speak with the current listed DPS Paul Keenan, I was told at this time that he was not available, he had apparently gone into the City for some food. I enquired as to who had been left in overall charge of the venue, Mr Gayle replied that he was. I told him that I was going to have a wander through the venue to ensure that the Premises License was being adhered to. As I walked through the bar area I could see customers buying and consuming alcohol, music was playing and people were generally in good spirits. I would estimate that over 100 people were in the main bar area with others out front and also in the smoking area which runs along the side of the building.

I walked to a set of double doors situated towards the rear of the main bar area, this area is called the "Kennel", through these doors is a lobby area and a counter where staff were taking tickets to allow entry into the main function room, entry is gained through another set of doors opposite the counter and to the right of where I was standing. As I opened the doors to enter the function room the noise was extremely loud, so much so it distorted the images on my body worn camera. I was surprised to see how many people were in the room, dancing and jumping about. It was at this time I felt I needed to get a member

of staff to explain to me where the fire exits were positioned and what training had been undertaken in case of an emergency.

I went back into the main bar area and looked for an available member of staff that may help me with my enquiries, I saw nobody in the vicinity so I re-entered the function room.

When I entered I started to make my way through the crowded room towards the double doors situated to the left looking from the main entrance. As I walked between the crowds I noticed two door staff standing in the alcove by the toilets, I made my way over to them and asked about the fire exits. I was told that we would have to make our way across the room to the exit in the far corner. I enquired about the double doors behind them as a possible escape route but was told that they couldn't be used.

I asked the door staff to show me the fire escape route, I followed him through the people on the dance floor to the double doors in the corner, and we went through these doors into a concourse with another set of double doors.

Once outside we entered an area I presume was allocated for the purpose of smoking, this area was completely covered over head with some sort of sheeting to protect against the elements. It did not look as if it complied with current smoking shelter legislation as I could see no where the smoke could freely escape? I was taken to a set of wooden gates that led to Bramble Street, the gate was opened and I walked into a very dark car park area. I walked towards the street and saw in the dark two vehicles parked and blocking the exit route. I doubled back and had a look around to see if any other route of escape was available, I noticed that the ground was uneven underfoot making it even harder to negotiate an escape, particularly with the lack of any light or "EXIT" signs to illuminate the way. Whilst looking down the side of the building back on to Becket Street, I saw that the way was blocked. I also noticed that the shutters were down on what I believe to be a set of double doors that lead into the function room, they were the same doors that I had enquired about whilst talking to the door staff a little earlier. That exit could certainly not be used in case of an emergency as the shutters were pulled down making it impossible to evacuate from the inside.

I went back to the parked vehicles, in front of me on the left was a large motor home, and parked to the right of it was a vehicle, possibly a Volvo car? I squeezed between the two vehicles and made my way to the street. I saw no emergency lighting or any signs to direct my safe passage if needed for escape from the building.

I made my way back into the premises and I asked the door staff by the wooden gate if he could tell me how many people were in the function room and the smoking area combined. He couldn't give me a figure but said that it was down to the ticket sales at the front desk and they should know.

I walked back between the crowds on the dance floor, through the doors back into the lobby area. I spoke to a female behind the counter and asked her how many people were in the function room. She told me that she did not have a clicker and could not tell me how many people were in the function room, she explained that the door staffs at the main entrance was monitoring numbers by using clickers as people entered the building. What concerned me at this point was that I had been made aware that a safe capacity number had been agreed with the Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service specifically for the function room. As the shutters were down rendering one set of double Fire Exit doors useless I was of the impression that no more than 300 people were allowed safely into that part of the building. No one however was monitoring the capacity into this room, I would estimate the people present were between 500-600, they'd be more in the whole building if you took into account those in the main bar and outdoor smoking areas at the rear, side and front of the building.

Continuation of Statement of Mark Dunn

I walked back to the front of the building and spoke to another door staff, Kevin Brand; I asked him how many people were in the function room. Mr Brand got extremely defensive and aggressive in his demeanour; he told me that he always "clicked" people into the premises at the front of the building and not specifically into each room. He showed me the "clicker" that he was using and it read 480. Whilst I was standing at the front of the building speaking to Brand, an unknown female said that she was also a member of the door staff and told me that 9 members of door staff were working; she was not wearing the required reflective jacket and could not be readily identified as door staff by her clothing. I questioned her about not displaying a current SIA badge and she then decided that she was not on duty but was available if required?

Mr Brand informed me that the function room had a capacity of 500 and there were only 480 in the whole building. I noticed whilst I was standing with Mr Brand, people were being refused entry as the premises was allegedly now at capacity and the policy for entry had reverted to one out, one in. I can say that whilst standing there I witnessed several people leaving but people in the queue were still not allowed to enter, this was confusing as if there was genuinely 480 people in the whole premises and customers were leaving it makes sense that others would then be allowed entry to fill the void and still not go over Mr Brands perceived capacity?

Apparently Mr Gayle had called the DPS Mr Keenan by telephone he informed me that he was only in the city and that he was on his way back to the venue to explain the situation to me and provide a copy of the Premises Licence. I waited for Mr Keenan to arrive but he didn't and unfortunately I had other incidents to attend on the Wardwick and had to leave.

I was surprised and disappointed that Mr Keenan did not attend when requested by his door staff; if he had he could have at least rectified some of the issues that were giving me serious concerns for the potential safety to the people within the premises. Mr Keenan has been told numerous times by responsible authorities about the issues of capacity in the building and his responsibilities to ensure people could evacuate safely in case of an emergency.

I was led to believe that the capacity of the building having read the fire risk assessment was a maximum of 300, with the shutters down I was not sure if this figure was reduced further, that is why I needed Mr Keenan to attend the premises and provide the Premises Licence and other documentation that would confirm the correct figures and any safety policies currently in place that I presume were agreed with the Fire Service. At the door staffs own admittance at least 480 people were in the building at this time, that was a minimum of 180 people over the safe permitted limit

Having left the premises without seeing Mr Keenan and the obvious lack of knowledge the people left in control of the venue had regarding safe capacities, at 00:30 I called the Derby Fire and Rescue Service and logged my concerns. I asked if possible a Fire Safety Inspector could attend the premises immediately giving suitable advice and make the venue safe if necessary. It was of my opinion that in the current state, customers and staff were being put in serious risk of harm should any unfortunate emergency occur at the venue with no obvious safe passage out.

Drafted statement after speaking to [REDACTED] on the phone. Have sent this to her for signing and have requested photographs of injuries:

'On SUNDAY 29th APRIL 2018 I was out in DERBY CITY CENTRE with my friends [REDACTED]. We'd gone out the evening before on the 28th APRIL 2018 and we'd been drinking and going to bars throughout the night. At approximately 02:30hrs on the 29th APRIL 2018 we decided to go to THE HAIRY DOG, DERBY but were turned away by the bouncer there. We regularly go to THE HAIRY DOG but, my friend MALLEY has tunnel vision which causes him to struggle to walk in a straight line, he also has to hold on to someone's arm to stop him from falling as he does not like to walk with a stick. Because of this the bouncer presumed that MALLEY was drunk and refused to let him through.

Although I had been allowed in, I stayed outside to talk to the bouncer and explain to him MALLEY'S condition, the bouncer explained to me that he understood but that he could not allow MALLEY to enter the bar. Whilst this conversation was taking place I became aware of a white female stood behind the bouncer. She had shoulder length black hair and was wearing a black dress with knee high black boots. She was stood with someone who I presumed to be her boyfriend who was walking with a limp, he was dressed fairly scruffily and had short brown hair. I was aware that the female was staring at me but I did not know her so I did not know why she'd be looking at me. I had tried to avoid looking in her direction but as my conversation with the bouncer came to an end I turned my head in her direction and it was at this point that she punched me in my mouth. She began to laugh at me and the male shouted at me calling me a 'SLAG'. I put my hand up to my mouth as it felt sore and there was a lot of blood, my lip had split from the impact of the punch and my teeth had also gone into my lip.

I was in a state of shock and began to shout at the female and my friends held me back, at this point the bouncer took the female to the floor and [REDACTED] and I turned and walked down the street and located a police officer who I informed of the incident. As I spoke to the officer, I could see that the female and her male friend were walking down the street towards us and I pointed them out to the officer.

I would estimate that there were 15 minutes between this and the initial incident.

Since the incident the injuries to my lip have healed but I have photos of the injuries which I have forwarded to PC 14697 FARMER on WEDNESDAY 9th MAY 2018, these have been exhibited as LB/1.'

Whilst on mobile patrol, officers are flagged down by a female, [REDACTED]. Eloise had blood on her face, she had swelling to her nose and cut lip. She was very intoxicated but informed me that she had been assaulted. She was with her friend, [REDACTED] and they said that they had been in the Hairy Dog pub. Whilst inside the pub, they said a group of Asian males had spoken to them and made lewd comments about putting their [REDACTED] [REDACTED] did not like this so has challenged their comments. A short time later, [REDACTED] have exited the Hairy Dog and have been stood outside of the pub when the same Asian males have spoken to them. One of the asian males has then [REDACTED] to the face [REDACTED] says that she has punched the male back to try and defend Eloise. They have then walked to the Charcoal Grill and ordered their food but the staff have seen the injuries / blood so they have flagged the police down.

This was reported to the police at 0345 hours so I was unable to check CCTV at the hairy dog pub as it was shut.

[REDACTED] was intoxicated and was not offering much info about the circumstances so it was not practical to obtain an SOE and she was not sure if she wanted to make a complaint or not. She allowed me to take an injury photo of her face.

[REDACTED] was also intoxicated and was reluctant to discuss the matter due to the fact that she punched the male back in defence of Eloise. Rowan did not want to make a statement and in any case, she was also too intoxicated.

They were taken to Derby Royal and dropped off their due to the fact [REDACTED] was bleeding and had been punched in the head.

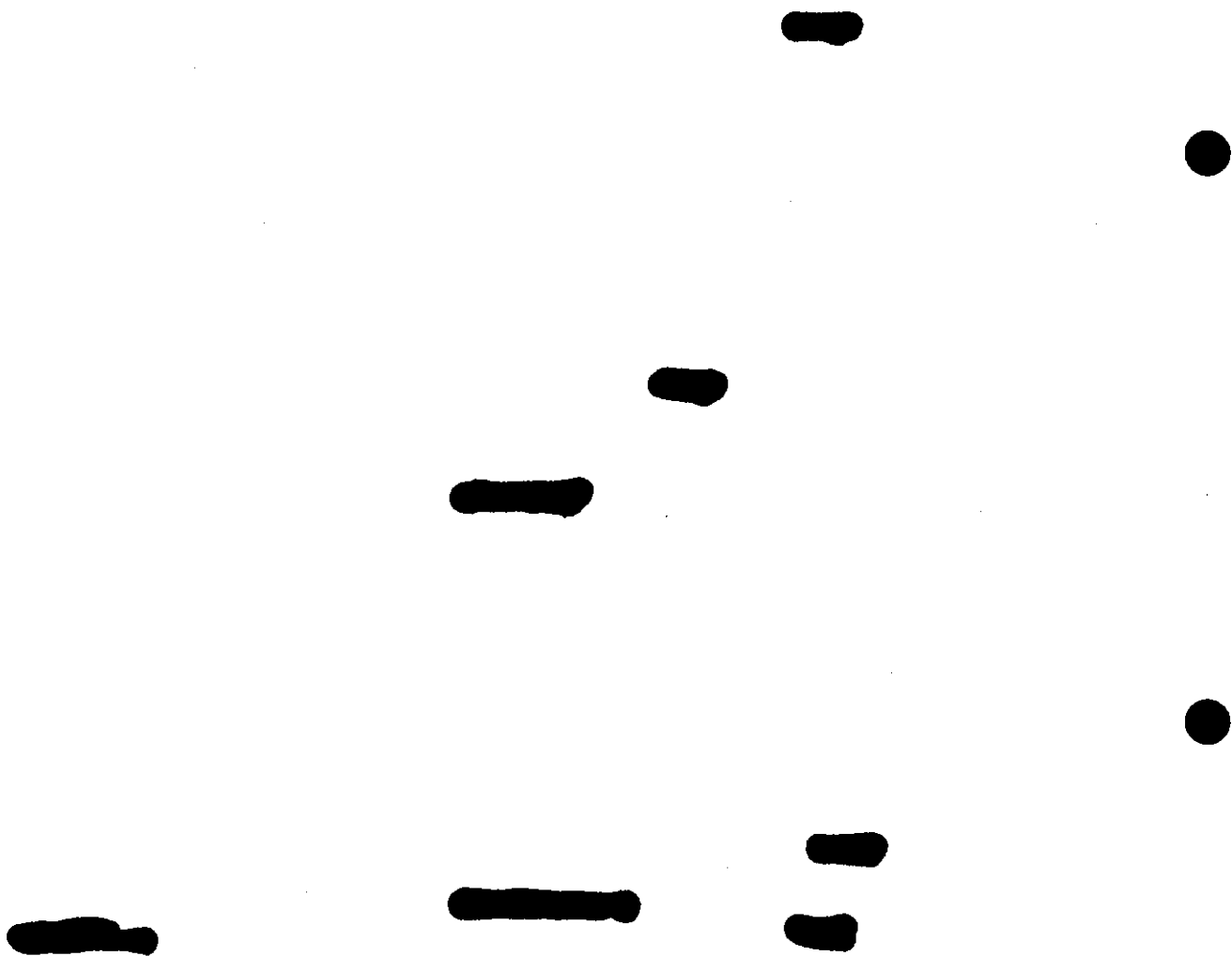

Sgt,

I note the latest task regarding the suspect [REDACTED] calling in wishing to make a complaint of assault, despite signing a Community Remedy form at the time acknowledging that she was at fault. I have spoken to her at length during which she became very abusive shouting claiming that she had been assaulted by being pulled out of the pub by her neck which had caused her some pain the following day. Both PC HODGSON and I therefore attended THE HAIRY DOG to view CCTV. I have now seized this and will file accordingly under this occurrence.

The footage clearly shows that [REDACTED] was NOT assaulted. If anything it shows [REDACTED] to be behaving far more aggressively than first thought. She is initially asked to leave the pub due to her drunken friends behaviour. An argument then takes place between [REDACTED] her female friend and pub staff. Her friend is walked out of the pub but then returns as [REDACTED] spends 3-4 minutes speaking with the involved doorman. As he walks her out she then strikes him. In turn he picks her up around the waste and carries her out of the pub, using very little force. He then places her down on her feet on the pavement and points to the road, clearly asking [REDACTED] and her friend to leave. As he turns his back to walk away [REDACTED] then lunges at him striking him a second time. At this point, with [REDACTED] very clearly the main aggressor the doorman then takes her to the floor. This appears to be a completely justified use of force by the doorman as he is being attacked for no apparent reason. As I see it, [REDACTED] can make no complaint of any kind against any of the HAIRY DOG staff. She is then held down on the floor until Police arrive. Any injuries she has received appear to be as a direct result of her own drunken actions.

PC HODGSON and I attended [REDACTED] home address as soon as we viewed CCTV but there was NRTK. We called her 3 times yesterday and I have tried twice just now. Her phone seemed to answer but there was no speech. The second time it just rang out. I do not intend to spend any further time now trying to catch up with [REDACTED] to discuss the matter further.

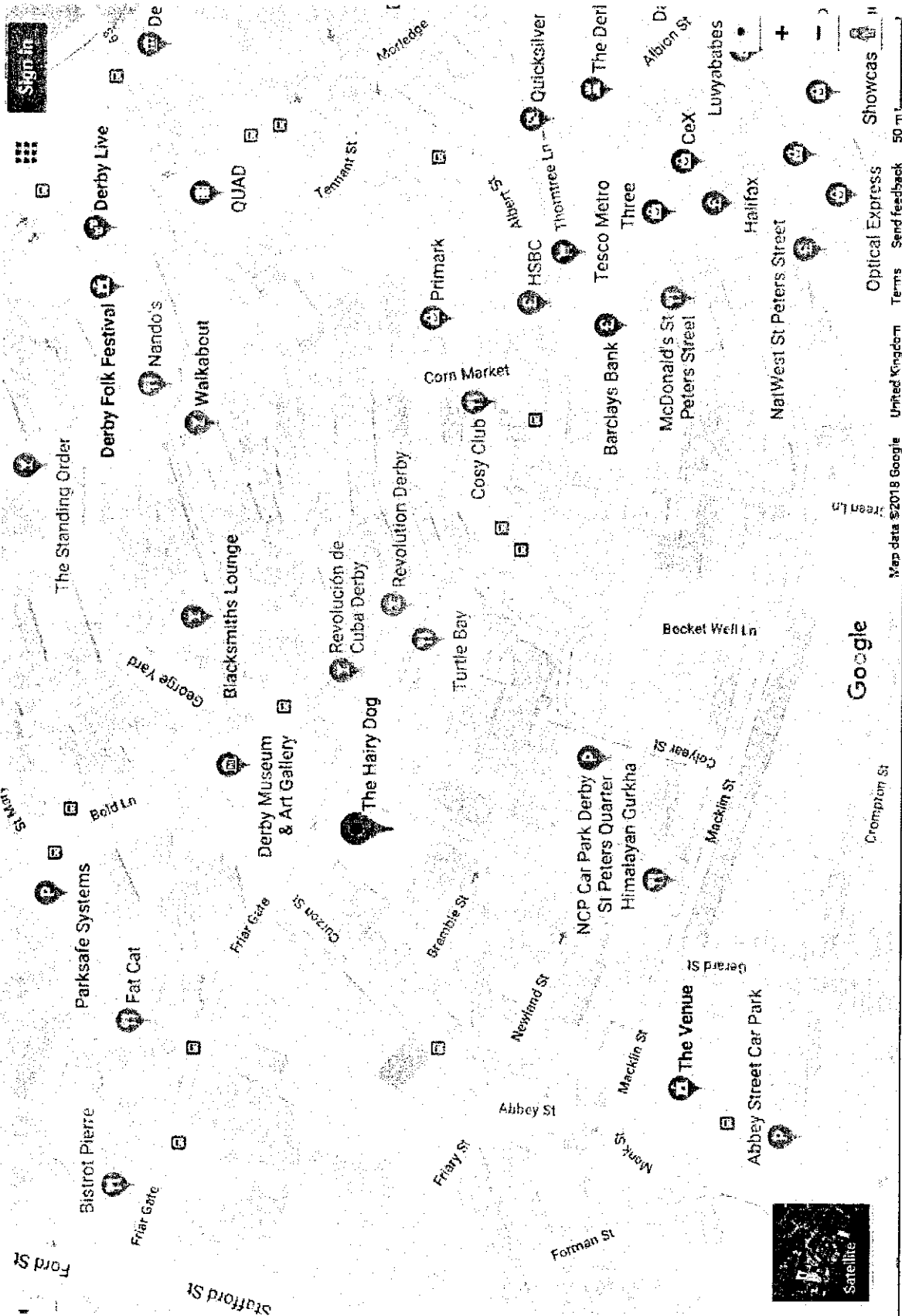

ANNEX 1 – MANDATORY CONDITIONS

SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –
 - a. at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
 - b. at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

DOOR SUPERVISION

3. Each individual required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industries Authority.

MANDATORY CONDITION IMPLEMENTED ON 28 MAY 2014.

- 1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 —
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula — $P = D + (D \times V)$
Where — P is the permitted price,



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(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014

1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."

(2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially



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similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner).

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either

(a) holographic mark or

(b) an ultraviolet feature

4. The responsible person must ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –



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- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS - EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1 No film shall be exhibited unless:
 - a. it has received a "U", "PG", "12A", "15", or "18" certificate of the British Board of Film Classification; or
 - b. it is a current newsreel, which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.
- 2 "18" Films
No person apparently under the age of eighteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 3 "15" Films
No person apparently under the age of fifteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "15" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 4 "12A" Films
No person apparently under the age of twelve years shall be admitted to any exhibition unless accompanied by an adult at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "12A" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 5 "PG" Films
Some scenes contained at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "PG" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, may be unsuitable for young children.



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- 6 "U" Films
Films suitable for all is any film, which has received a "U", certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 7 Permission of Licensing Authority
Notwithstanding the above, a film may be exhibited, or persons, or any class of person, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are complied with.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS SET BY LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE ON 19/02/16

CONDITIONS RELATING TO CRIME AND DISORDER

- 1) A CCTV system shall be installed and operating at all times. The cameras are to be positioned so as to ensure that all parts of the premises to which the public has access are sufficiently covered (save any toilet areas).
- 2) All recordings will be made in real time and shall be retained for a minimum of 28 days and made available for the view at the reasonable request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within section 13 Licensing Act 2003.
- 3) The recording system is to be secure and maintained in good working order and any faults repaired as soon as possible.

CONDITIONS RELATION TO PUBLIC SAFETY

- 4) An incident log will be maintained at the premises and all relevant incidents recorded within the log. The log will be written, retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5) A written drugs policy will be maintained and adhered to at the premises and be available for



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production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 6) The requirement for SIA registered door supervisors and toilet attendants is to be risk assessed and agreed with the local Police Licensing Department, a copy of the risk assessment is to be provided to the Licensing Authority. Once agreed, the risk assessment may only be amended with the prior written agreement of the local Police Licensing Department.
- 7) A minimum of two door staff will be on duty every Friday and Saturday evening from 21:00 when the premises are open for licensable activities.
- 8) A minimum of two door staff will be on duty at all times when live entertainment is being held at the premises.
- 9) SIA registered door supervisors employed at the premises will wear high visibility jackets/ clothing to distinguish them in their role and make them easily identifiable.
- 10) SIA registered door supervisors shall be equipped with an appropriate method of keeping an accurate record of the capacity levels.
- 11) A daily record of the door supervisors that work at the premises (whether paid or unpaid) will be retained at the premises and will include:
 - start time and finish time of each door supervisor
 - SIA badge number
 - Door supervisor's will sign and print their name in a legible form
 - Each entry will be countersigned by the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 12) The door supervisors log will be retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 The Licensing Act 2003.



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- 13) No customer of the premises shall be allowed to take an alcoholic drink from the premises in an open container unless to an external area set aside for consumption as per the plan.
- 14) The first use of the premises for any of the licensable activities the subject of this grant shall not take place until the Premises Licence Holder deposits with each of the Licensing Authority, Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service and Derbyshire Constabulary, a copy of:
- i. a suitable fire safety risk assessment (which must be approved by the Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service), within which a maximum occupancy figure (to include all personnel employed at the premises by the Premises Licence Holder, any performers engaged for an event on the premises, the event organiser (and any representatives of theirs) and patrons) shall be recorded. It shall also include an assessment of the optimal number of staff to be employed on the premises during the hours when licensable activity is ongoing. For the avoidance of doubt, references to staff exclude those personnel to be employed as door supervisors where a need to employ door supervisors arises;
 - ii. Confirmation of compliance with fire safety regulations.
- 15) The premises shall operate with the dispersal policy which was verified on 19 February 2016.
- 16) Notices must be displayed in the premises in prominent position which warn customers about the need to be aware of pick pockets or bag snatchers, and to guard their property.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO PUBLIC NUISANCE

- 17) No noise from regulated entertainment, including repetitive bass noise, shall be audible from within noise sensitive premises with their windows open in a typical manner for ventilation.
- 18) No amplified music or speech shall be relayed externally via loud speakers other than for events with the prior approval of the Licensing Authority.
- 19) The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events. A record of all complaints and any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a "complaints logbook" kept specifically for that purpose. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police Officer, or any other authorised person as detailed



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within section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003, upon their request.

- 20) The licence holder, Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or a suitably trained nominated representative, shall monitor the noise from time to time outside noise sensitive premises, during every event involving amplified music or speech. If as a result of such monitoring, it is considered that the noise levels are excessive, immediate action should be taken to reduce the volume to acceptable levels.
- 21) Sound levels from amplified music shall be set at a level agreed in writing with the Environmental Protection Team, Environment and Regulatory Services, Derby City Council. The agreed level, which will be based on avoidance of noise nuisance to nearby sensitive receptors, shall not be exceeded at any time.
- 22) The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) shall ensure that clear prominent and legible notices must be displayed internally at all exits, requesting customers and other users to leave the premises and the area local to the premises quietly and in an orderly manner respecting the needs of local residents.
- 23) Customers or other users of the premises can only smoke in the designated smoking area agreed and outlined on the submitted plan of the premises.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

- 24) Full training to be provided to all staff on commencement of employment relating to age restricted sales and any systems and procedures that they are expected to follow in the course of age restricted sales will be provided to them.
- 25) Refresher training will be provided every 12 months.
- 26) Records detailing the training provided will be written and retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003.
- 27) A challenge 25 policy/ proof of age scheme will be operated at all times.



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- 28) Clear signage will be displayed at the entrances/ exits to the premises informing customers of the challenge 25 policy/ proof of age scheme.
- 29) A system of recording sales refused under the challenge 25/ proof of age scheme shall be operated at all times. The system will be written and retained at the premises for a minimum of 12 months and kept on the premises for production upon reasonable request of a Police Officer or authorised person as detailed in section 13 of The Licensing Act 2003.
- 30) Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.
- 31) No children are permitted on the premises after 20:00 hours

The Hairy Dog Dispersal Policy

Introduction

This policy sets out the steps the venue will take at the end of the trading session to minimise the potential for issues as customers leave the premises. The policy will be kept under constant review to address any issues should they arise.

The policy is based on a number of relevant factors but the primary factors include the long term experience of what happens at the venue every week when people disperse at the end of the evening, the type of customers that frequent the venue and how this is managed at present.

The Venue

The venue is a live music venue that is very prominent and respected in the UK for the quality of the bands and events it holds. Approximately 20 bands play a week and the bands that play there are touring bands from all over the world and the UK. They play all day and into the evening.

The audience for these bands are made up of 2 distinct groups. There are travelling fans from all over the UK who come to the venue from far and wide by coach and train. The remainder are local people. This has considerable relevance to the way that the people disperse at the end of the evening as it means they leave at different times. Travelling fans have a journey to make at the end of the evening and tend to leave as soon as the band finishes. Some travelling fans stay locally in hotels.

With the exception of local events (which take place on rare occasions) the events are online ticket sales and approximately 80 % of all tickets are pre-sold this way. That means the operators know how many people are coming to the venue for a particular band and are able to plan in advance accordingly.

The procedure outlined below is based on the well-established gradual pattern of dispersal from the premises which works well.

Timings

The venue already benefits from a terminal hour for alcohol sales at 3am and closure of the premises at 3.30am. The music ending at 12 midnight and the 3 to 3.30am terminal hour are key to the natural & gradual dispersal of the customers over a 3 hour period.

Function room

Live music to finish at 0000

Last orders at the bar 0145

Bar closes & recorded music to finish at 0200

Room closes 0200

Main Public Bar

Last orders at the bar 0245

Bar closes & recorded music to finish at 0300

Venue closes 0330

Music & Lighting

Music volume will be reduced at 0245

At 0300 - All cleaning lights go on at 0300 (transforms the venue from dark to almost daylight).

Music turned off

Doorstaff patrol the premises asking customers to drink up and leave the premises quietly 0300

Cloakroom

The cloakroom will be set up in order to assist the swift return of coats.

Minimising Noise on Exit

SIA Doorstaff will oversee the end of night departure period. They will be on the street as another set of eyes and ears identifying potential problems. They will encourage customers to vacate the area outside the premises and not to congregate outside the venue.

SIA Doorstaff will direct customers to the nearest taxi ranks or other transportation away from the area.

Transport

There is a taxi rank directly outside the venue.

Where the gig is likely to be popular, all taxi companies will be informed of the date and times of the gig so that adequate taxis are provided.
